MATRIMONY

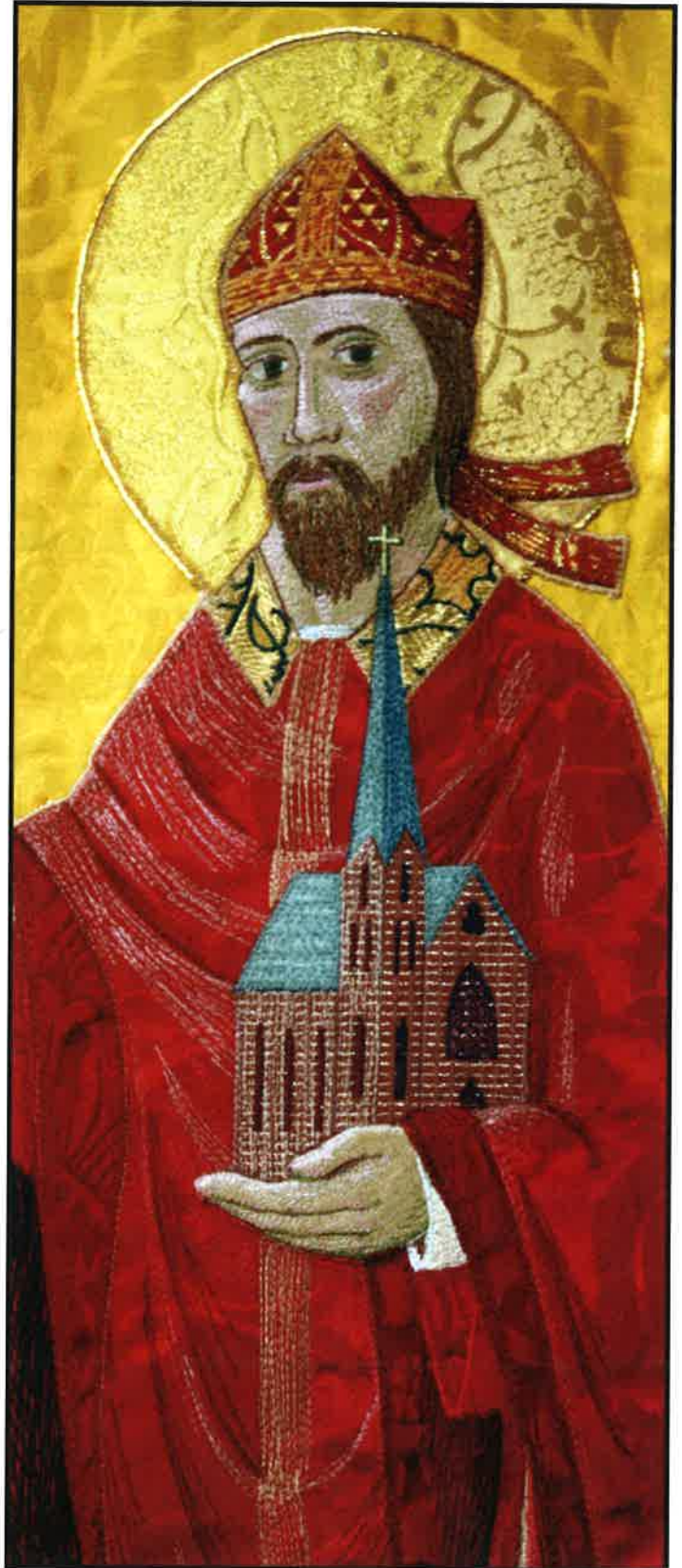

The Women of St. Colman of Cloyne Meeting Minutes

August 31, 2021

The 2021 -2022 kickoff meeting was held August 31 at 7:00 pm. Twenty-one women were in attendance. We had a beautiful wine and cheese charcuterie spread before and during the meeting.

In the president's absence, the meeting was called to order by Secretary Mary Murdock. Father Haddad gave a blessing to our group and for our work for the coming year. We then took a few minutes to introduce ourselves, since this was our first evening meeting, and we had several people attend who can't make our daytime meetings. The minutes were read and approved. Treasurer Tina Garland gave the treasurer's report. Our current balance is \$11,675.86. The report was filed for audit. Tina stated she needs an email from Carolyn to pay a Mass stipend for Bob VanDyke.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

A volunteer sign-up sheet listing the following activities was passed around so members could volunteer to help with them. Chairs or coordinators are needed for the All Souls Reception, the Religious Articles Sale, The Giving Tree and the clean-up committee for funeral luncheons. If you would like to help with any of the following activities and/or chair any of those where spots are open, please contact president Carolyn Shoemaker.

All Souls Reception: This is the reception following the All Souls Mass on November 2 to remember those lost in our parish the past year. A committee chair is needed to start planning as soon as possible.

Funeral Meals: There has been a request for aprons to be used by the Funeral meals committee only. It is suggested that they be a different color than the other aprons used and that they be embroidered or stamped with "Women of St Colman". Discussion included what color we wanted, embroidered or stamped, how many aprons and how much they would cost. It was agreed that a royal blue would be a good color choice. Helen Grim suggested we spend no more than \$200 on them. Gwynne Gibson said she would check into our options and report at the next meeting. We need a chair for clean-up committee.

Giving Tree: We work with the four long-term care facilities in the county to provide Christmas gifts to those without families so they have gifts to open at their Christmas gatherings. A committee chair is needed for this committee. The Christmas tree with gift tags will be in the back of church November 20-21. Gifts are to be returned by December 4-5.

Religious Articles Sale: Scheduled for November 13-14. A chair is needed.

Rummage Sale: The Rummage Sale was held June 11-12. Helen Grim reported it was a huge success, as we only had a few weeks to prepare for it. We made \$2151 and had a good turnout from the community. Next year's sale is scheduled for June 10-11. We will need lots of volunteers for this event.

Senior Lunch: The first Senior Lunch for 2021 will be held Thursday, October 14. Helen Grim reported that we will probably be holding these lunches quarterly. Please sign up if you would like to help with this.

Sunshine/Words of Hope: Pat Woodard has agreed to stay on as chair of this committee. There was a discussion at previous meetings that there was some confusion about the name and purpose of the committee. Several options were given on names and it was decided to change the name to "Words of Hope Card Ministry".

Old Business: None

New Business:

- * A Hostess sign-up sheet was passed around for volunteers to host our upcoming meetings.
- * We will host a Christmas party (separate from our monthly meeting) December 11 for the parish. We need help to organize this. We will discuss this at the next meeting.
- * Do we continue with donations to non-profit groups after each meeting? Is it ok for non-profit to gift to non-profits? The Finance Council decided not to continue that practice, so do we also want to follow suit? There was much discussion and several good points on both sides. No decision was reached at this time. This was tabled until our next meeting.
- * Gwynne Gibson suggested, and several people agreed, that we need to add something to our agenda to foster our religion. Patty Brown talked about some form of faith sharing. It was suggested we meet with Father Haddad for some guidance on this.
- * It was suggested that we post the meeting minutes on our web site and in the bulletin.

The next meeting will be **Wednesday October 6, at 7:00 pm** in the Parish Center Conference Room with Bridget Sollars, Sue Smith and Mary Kay Sollars as hosts. Father Haddad led us in closing prayers and the meeting was adjourned

To enhance our worship during the Holy Sacrifice, I will be training altar servers. Serving at the altar of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is a great privilege and a greater honor. It can be intensely spiritually rewarding, but it takes a lot of work and a great deal of commitment. Training and practice will begin in the Church building on Saturday, September 18th at 9am for those who are interested. (Those of you who have been altar servers in the past are also required to attend this training) Servers will learn not just the various roles of the server, but the art of serving well.

To be a server you must be registered at the parish and must have received first Holy Communion. In order to conduct the liturgical action of the Mass to its potential we must have serving teams of four on Saturdays and five on Sundays. This means we need adult servers as well. Serving at the altar is both a great gift and a great blessing, so please, consider volunteering. If you want to be a server but can't attend the training on September 18, please let Tina in the Parish Office know of your interest.
