## **Divine Mercy Minute:**

Corporal Works of Mercy: Bury the Dead

For my homeland is heaven- this I firmly believe. (1589)

How can we "bury the dead" in the literal sense? One important way is to advocate "in word, deed, and prayer" for the proper funeral for and burial of deceased family members- including the appropriate disposition of ashes, in the case of cremation. The benefits of this particular work of mercy extend both to the living and the dead; by helping the bereaved to mourn, we are given an opportunity to deal with death physically, spiritually and emotionally- and to teach our children as well.

Attend wakes, funerals and burials. Attending a wake, funeral and burial can be very touching act of mercy.

Send a Mass card or have a Mass offered. When attending the wake or funeral is not possible, send the gift of a Mass card to the family as a way of living mercy. Check with your parish office about having a Mass offered in memory of the deceased.
