By offering God the Father His “most dearly beloved Son”, we are using the most convincing argument with which to be heard. We are asking for mercy “for us and for the whole world”. The word “us” refers to the person reciting the chaplet and those for whom he desires to offer it or for whom he should pray. The “whole world” indicates all people living on earth and the souls in Purgatory.
