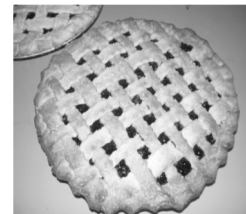

The episcopal college and its head, the Pope

880 When Christ instituted the Twelve, "he constituted (them) in the form of a college or permanent assembly, at the head of which he placed Peter, chosen from among them." Just as "by the Lord's institution, St. Peter and the rest of the apostles constitute a single apostolic college, so in like fashion the Roman Pontiff, Peter's successor, and the bishops, the successors of the apostles, are related with and united to one another."

881 The Lord made Simon alone, whom he named Peter, the "rock" of his Church. He gave him the keys of his Church and instituted him shepherd of the whole flock. "The office of binding and loosing which was given to Peter was also assigned to the college of apostles united to its head." This Pastoral office of Peter and the other apostles belongs to the Church's very foundation and is continued by the bishops under the primacy of the Pope.

882 The *Pope*, Bishop of Rome and Peter's successor, "is the perpetual and visible source and foundation of the unity both of the bishops and of the whole company of the faithful." "For the Roman Pontiff, by reason of his office as Vicar of Christ, and as pastor of the entire Church has full, supreme, and universal power over the whole Church, a power which he can always exercise unhindered."

883 "The *college or body of bishops* has no authority unless united with the Roman Pontiff, Peter's successor, as its head." As such, this college has "supreme and full authority over the universal Church; but this power cannot be exercised without the agreement of the Roman Pontiff."

You are invited to participate in the Sunday morning Catechetical Apostolate following the 8 am Holy Mass each Sunday morning. This year, we will be studying from the various series (such as *Rediscover Catholicism*) presented by Matthew Kelly and *Dynamic Catholic*. We meet in the large meeting room (Quilter's Room) in the lower level of the Parish hall and we follow the PSR schedule. (Exception: our class is over at 10:30). All parents dropping children off for PSR (Catholic and non-Catholic), please consider joining the class. Everyone learns something new almost every week!

The Tuesday Night Bible Study Group meets at 7:00 pm each Tuesday night to study the Holy Scriptures, pray together and have a joyful time. Currently they are studying the Book of Genesis. They also get together in the Quilter's Room on the lower level of the Hall.

If you are unable to physically attend either of these classes, you may wish to participate in the **free** Home Study courses on the Catholic Faith sponsored by the Vincentian Community and the Missouri Knights of Columbus Religious Information Bureau. Studying from your home, nine courses are available to help you learn more about and understand our Catholic Faith. The Catholic Home Study Service (CHSS) can even be used as a step toward becoming Catholic.
