Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"I have come to set the earth on fire." Pope Benedict XVI wrote that the fire is Christ's own Passion of love, "a fire that is to be handed on. St. Bernard - 1090 - 1153 Tues., Aug. 20
dominated the century in which he lived. At age 22 he joined the Cistercian monks. Shortly after made Abbot of Clairvaux, Bernard by words and actions encouraged his monks to outstanding virtue. He influenced Popes and kings, traveled to bring peace and unity, preached the Second Crusade. He wrote much and wrote movingly concerning the Lord Jesus, spirituality, the Scriptures and the Blessed Mother. Bernard died on this date in 1153

St. Pius X - Wed., Aug. 21
Born near Venice in 1835, Giuseppe Sarto became successively priest, bishop of Mantua, Patriarch of Venice and, in 1903, Pope. Humble and strong, he carried these increasingly heavy responsibilities with simplicity, piety and balance. He authorized First Holy Communion at the age of reason and strongly defended the Church against Modernism. Pius X died as World War I started, in 1914, and was canonized a saint in 1954.

Queenship of Mary - Thurs., Aug. 22
One week after the Assumption we celebrate the Fifth Glorious Mystery of the Rosary. In 1954 Pope Pius XII directed that this feast be celebrated each year on this day. The Pope called for a renewal on this day of the consecration of the human race to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary

St. Bartholomew - Sat., Aug. 24
One of the twelve foundation stones of the Church, this Apostle was born at Cana of Galilee. He was brought to Jesus by Philip. Tradition holds that after the Ascension he preached the Gospel in India and there met martyrdom. Because of differing lists of the Twelve, Bartholomew is usually identified with the Nathanael described in the Fourth Gospel.

DISCIPLESHIP

The Church - revealed by the Holy Spirit

767 "When the work which the Father gave the Son to do on earth was accomplished, the Holy Spirit was sent on the day of Pentecost in order that he might continually sanctify the Church." Then "the church was openly displayed to the crowds and the spread of the Gospel among the nations, through preaching, was begun." As the "convocation" of all men for salvation, the church in her very nature is missionary, sent by Christ to all the nations to make disciples of them.

768 So that she can fulfill her mission, the Holy spirit "bestows upon the Church varied hierarchic and charismatic gifts, and in this way directs her." "Henceforward the Church, endowed with the gifts of her founder and faithfully observing his precepts of charity, humility and self-denial, receives the mission of proclaiming and establishing among all peoples the Kingdom of Christ and of God, and she is on earth the seed and the beginning of that kingdom."

The Church is communion with Jesus

787 From the beginning, Jesus associated his disciples with his own life, revealed the mystery of the Kingdom to them, and gave them a share in his mission, joy, and sufferings. Jesus spoke of a still more intimate communion between him and those who would follow him: "Abide in me, and I in you. . . I am the vine, you are the branches." And he proclaimed a mysterious and real communion between his own body and ours: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him."
