St. Peter Claver - Monday, September 9th

This was a life of heroic dedication. Born in Spain in 1580, Peter Claver vowed to become a missionary in America. Ordained as a Jesuit, 1616 in Columbia, he vowed to serve Negro slaves. Peter would meet the African slave ships at Cartagena and enter the infested hold to care for the dead, dying and sick. He instructed and baptized the slaves, helped them on their plantations, and brought 300,00 to Christ and the Church. Peter Claver, who called himself the 'slave of the negroes forever,' died September 8, 1654, and was canonized a saint in 1888.

St. John Chrysostom - Friday, September 13th

Born at Antioch around 349, today's saint received an excellent education, led an ascetical life, as a priest preached effectively. Elected Bishop and Patriarch of Constantinople in 397, John 'of the Golden Tongue' was a thorough, dedicated pastor of his flock. From hatred of the imperial court and enemies he was twice exiled. In present day Turkey, on the road to exile again, he died of consumption on September 14,407.

CATECHISM

Jesus consummates his sacrifice on the Cross

616 It is love "to the end" that confers on Christ's sacrifice its value as redemption and reparation, as atonement and satisfaction. He knew and loved us all when he offered his life. Now "the love of Christ controls us, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore all have died." No man, not even the holiest, was ever able to take on himself the sins of all men and offer himself as a sacrifice for all. The existence in Christ of the divine person of the Son, who at once surpasses and embraces all human persons and constitutes himself as the Head of all mankind, makes possible his redemptive sacrifice *for all*.
