St. Charles Borromeo - Monday, November 4th

St. Charles Borromeo was born at Arona in Lombardy in the year 1538. After having taken honors in both civil and canon law, he was made cardinal of Milan by his uncle, Pope Pius IV. As a true pastor of his flock, he tirelessly promoted Christian life by the reform of his diocese, the convocation of synods, and the promulgation of regulations intended to foster the church's mission. He died on November 3, 1584.

Saturday, November 9th - **The anniversary of the dedication of the Lateran Basilica**, which was erected by the Emperor Constantine, as been observed on this day since the twelfth century. This feast was at first observed only in Rome but later in honor of the basilica, which is called the mother church of Christendom, the celebration was extended to the whole Latin Church. This action was taken as a sign of devotion to and of unity with the Chair of Peter which, as St. Ignatius of Antioch wrote, "presides over the whole assembly of charity."

Catechism - Interior Repentance

1431 Interior repentance is a radical reorientation of our whole life, a return, a conversion to God with all our heart, and end of sin, a turning away from evil, with repugnance toward the evil actions we have committed. At the same time it entails the desire and resolution to change one's life, with hope in god's mercy and trust in the help of his grace. This conversion of heart is accompanied by a salutary pain and sadness which the Fathers called *animi cruciatus*, affliction of spirit and *compunctio cordis*, repentance of heart.

1423 It is called the *sacrament of conversion* because it makes sacramentally present Jesus' call to conversion, the first step in returning to the Father from whom one has strayed by sin. It is called the *sacrament of Penance*, since it consecrates the Christian sinner's personal and ecclesial steps of conversion, penance, and satisfaction.

1427 Jesus calls to conversion. This call is an essential part of the proclamation of the kingdom: "the time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the gospel." In the church's preaching this call is addressed first to those who do not yet know Christ and his Gospel. Also, baptism is the principal place for the first and fundamental conversion. It is by faith in the Gospel and by Baptism that one renounces evil and gains salvation, that is, the forgiveness of all sins and the gift of new life.
