DISCIPLES

The Church - revealed by the Holy Spirit

767 “When the work which the Father gave the Son to do on earth was accomplished, the Holy Spirit was sent on the day of Pentecost in order that he might continually sanctify the Church.” Then “the Church was openly displayed to the crowds and the spread of the Gospel among the nations, through preaching, was begun.” As the “convocation” of all men for salvation, the church in her very nature is missionary, sent by Christ to all the nations to make disciples of them.

768 So that she can fulfill her mission, the Holy Spirit “bestows upon the Church varied hierarchic and charismatic gifts, and in this way directs her.” “Henceforward the Church, endowed with the gifts of her founder and faithfully observing his precepts of charity, humility and self-denial, receives the mission of proclaiming and establishing among all peoples the Kingdom of Christ and of God, and she is on earth the seed and the beginning of that kingdom.”

The Church - perfected in glory

769 “The Church . . . will receive its perfection only in the glory of heaven,” at the time of Christ’s glorious return. Until that day, “the Church progresses on her pilgrimage amidst this world’s persecutions and God’s consolations.” Here below she knows that she is in exile far from the Lord, and longs for the full coming of the Kingdom, when she will “be united in glory with her king.” The Church, and through her the world, will not be perfected in glory without great trials. Only then will “all the just from the time of Adam, ‘from Abel, the just one, to the last of the elect,’ . . . be gathered together in the universal Church in the Father’s presence.”

770 The Church is in history, but at the same time she transcends it. It is only “with the eyes of faith” that one can see her in her visible reality and at the same time in her spiritual reality as bearer of divine life.

783 Jesus Christ is the one whom the Father anointed with the Holy Spirit and established as priest, prophet, and king. The whole People of God participates in these three offices of Christ and bears the responsibilities for mission and service that flow from them.

The Church - Body of Christ

787 From the beginning, Jesus associated his disciples with his own life, revealed the mystery of the Kingdom to them, and gave them a share in his mission, joy, and sufferings. Jesus spoke of a still more intimate communion between him and those who would follow him: “Abide in me, and I in you. . . I am the vine, you are the branches.” And he proclaimed a mysterious and real communion between his own body and ours: “He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him.”

St. Paulinus of Nola - Monday, June 22

Paulinus was born in Bordeaux, received a classical education, and became governor of Campania in Italy at twenty-six. His pagan beliefs were tried when he witnessed miraculous healings at the shrine of St. Felix the Martyr. After seeking direction from St. Ambrose, he came into the Church. The death of Paulinus’ eight-day-old son sparked his second conversion. He and his wife Theresia sold all they had and went to Nola. They lived as brother and sister, pursued prayer, and attended to the poor. In 409, the people of Nola elected Paulinus bishop. He served them until his death in 431. “The man without Christ is dust and shadow,” Paulinus wrote.

Solemnity of the Nativity of John the Baptist Wednesday, June 24

Why does the Church celebrate the birthday of John the Baptist? Because “John surpasses all the prophets, of whom he is the last” (CCC 523) He “goes ‘before the Lord in the spirit and power of Elijah’”. John the Baptist “is the Lord’s immediate precursor or forerunner, sent to prepare his way,” who “inaugurates the Gospel. . . from his mother’s womb”. John the Baptist “proclaims the imminence of the consolation of Israel; he is the ‘voice of the Consoler who is coming’”. “With John the Baptist, the Holy Spirit begins the restoration to man of ‘the divine likeness’”.
