Right to Exercise Religious Freedom

- 1738 Freedom is exercised in relationships between human beings. Every human person, created in the image of God, has the natural right to be recognized as a free and responsible being. All owe to each other this duty of respect. The *right to the exercise of freedom*, especially in moral and religious matters, is an inalienable requirement of the dignity of the human person. This right must be recognized and protected by civil authority within the limits of the common good and public order.
- 1782 Man has the right to act in conscience and in freedom so as personally to make moral decisions. "He must not be forced to act contrary to his conscience. Nor must he be prevented from acting according to his conscience, especially in religious matters."
- 2008 The merit of man before God in the Christian life arises from the fact that *God has freely chosen to associate man with the work of his grace*. The fatherly action of God is first on his own initiative, and then follows man's free acting through his collaboration, so that the merit of good works is to be attributed in the first place to the grace of God, then to the faithful. Man's merit, moreover, itself is due to God, for his good actions proceed in Christ, from the predispositions and assistance given by the Holy Spirit.

Stewardship Awareness

"For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."
Matthew 11:30

St. Maria Goretti - Monday, July 6

Maria was born of poor but devout farm laborers in Corinaldo, Italy. After her father's death, little Maria helped her mother care for the family. At the age of eleven she convinced a friend to instruct her in the catechism, and she made her First Communion in a borrowed dress. Only a few months later, a nineteen-year-old farm laborer attempted to rape her. When Maria begged him not to commit such a grave sin, he stabbed her repeatedly. She died having offered him forgiveness. St. John Paul II taught that Maria's life "encourages us to experience the joy of the poor, who know how to renounce everything, provided they do not lose the one thing necessary: the friendship of God."

St. Augustine Zhao Rong & Companions Thursday, July 9

This feast commemorates the sacrifice of 120 martyrs in China from 1648 to 1930. These men and women—priests, nuns, seminarians, and laypersons—represent untold others who gave their lives in diverse persecutions over a long and difficult history. During one period, the "Boxer Rebellion" in 1900, an estimated 25,000 Chinese Catholics were martyred. The Boxer rebels terrorized Christians, who were publicly condemned as "wicked and cruel." At Shanxi, seven Franciscan Missionaries of Mary were beheaded. "Do not be afraid," Sister Marie de Sante-Nathalie was heard to say. "Death is only God who is passing by."

St. Benedict - Saturday, July 11

Benedict was born in Norcia, Italy, around the year 480. At Monte Cassino, near Naples, he composed a Rule to "establish a school for the Lord's service." The Rule provides a practical guide for monastic life, establishing the rhythms of prayer and work and the right relations among the monks. "For its moderation, humanity, and sober discernment between the essential and the secondary in spiritual life, his Rule has retained its illuminating power even to today" (Pope Benedict XVI). The communities founded by Benedict—including the Cistercian and Camaldolese offshoots—are found worldwide.
