### St. John Vianney - Tuesday, August 4

Born of peasant stock in Dardilly, France, John desired from a young age to be a priest. After years of difficult study in the seminary, he was ordained and assigned to the village of Ars, near Lyons. He brought Christ to his parishioners through the fervent celebration of the Eucharist, assistance to the poor, and, above all, the Sacrament of Penance. Reputed to have the gift of seeing souls, he spent between eleven and sixteen hours a day reconciling sinners to God. Hundreds of pilgrims availed themselves of his aid every week. The cure was still hearing confessions from his bed a few days before his death on August 4, 1859.

### Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord - Thursday, August 6

The resplendence of the Transfiguration reveals the fullness of life destined to be ours; we glimpse the glory God wills for our humanity. But we experience a transfiguration like that of Jesus only by configuration to Jesus. As we peer into the glory that pours from every pore of the transfigured Christ, we cast off everything unworthy of our personal relationship with the Savior. We do this especially through confession and the Eucharist, where Jesus gazes back at us with a look of love that makes us desire to live his luminous beauty. Silently from Tabor's splendor, the Savior tells us: "Become what you behold!" And we fall silent in adoration, content to be with Jesus alone.

### St. Dominic - Saturday, August 8

Dominic was born around 1170 in Calaruega, Spain, and joined the Augustinian Canons. While preaching against the Albigensian heresy in France, he saw the need for solid preachers of the Gospel who would be fortified by study, strengthened by prayer, and confirmed in poverty. The men who followed Dominic in this new form of religious life became known as the Order of Preachers, or the Dominicans. Dominic died in 1221 surrounded by his friars.

1406 Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live for ever, . . . he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and . . . abides in me, and I in him."

1407 The Eucharist is the heart and the summit of the Church's life, for in it Christ associates his Church and all her members with his sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving offered once for all on the cross to his Father; by this sacrifice he pours out the graces of salvation on his Body which is the Church.

1408 The Eucharistic celebration always includes: the proclamation of the Word of God; thanksgiving to God the Father for all his benefits, above all the gift of his Son; the consecration of bread and wine; and participation in the liturgical banquet by receiving the Lord's body and blood. These elements constitute one single act of worship.

1409 The Eucharist is the memorial of Christ's Pass-over, that is, of the work of salvation accomplished by the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, a work made present by the liturgical action.

1410 It is Christ himself, the eternal high priest of the New Covenant who, acting through the ministry of the priests, offers the Eucharistic sacrifice. And it is the same Christ, really present under the species of bread and wine, who is the offering of the Eucharistic sacrifice.

1411 Only validly ordained priests can preside at the Eucharist and consecrate the bread and the wine so that they become the Body and Blood of the Lord.
