### St. Lawrence - Monday, August 10

St. Lawrence was one of the Roman church's seven deacons who were personally responsible for the care of the city's poor. When the Roman clergy was rooted out and killed under the Emperor Valerian in the year 258, Lawrence saw his beloved Pope Sixtus II hauled off to martyrdom. Tradition says that Lawrence at once liquidated the Church's possessions and dispersed them to the poor. When the prefect of Rome heard of this, he demanded that Lawrence turn over the money. Three days later Lawrence brought him the "Church's treasure": the destitute, the orphans, the blind, and the lame, For this, Lawrence was roasted on a gridiron.

## TRUST

301 With creation, God does not abandon his creatures to themselves. He not only gives them being and existence, but also, and at every moment, upholds and sustains them in being, enables them to act and brings them to their final end. Recognizing this utter dependence with respect to the Creator is a source of wisdom and freedom, of joy and confidence.

305 Jesus asks for childlike abandonment to the providence of our heavenly Father who takes care of his children's smallest needs: "Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' . . . your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well."

2547 The Lord grieves over the rich, because they find their consolation in the abundance of goods. "Let the proud seek and love earthly kingdoms, but blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven." Abandonment to the providence of the Father in heaven frees us from anxiety about tomorrow. Trust in God is a preparation for the blessedness of the poor. They shall see God.

### St. Clare - Tuesday, August 11

Beautiful and rich, at eighteen Clare renounced everything to follow Christ in the manner of Francis of Assisi. With him she co-founded the Poor Clares, establishing a first house at San Damiano. The women went barefoot, wore rough tunics and begged for food. It was in 1234 that Clare famously displayed the Blessed Sacrament on the convent wall as Frederick II's army attacked. Prostrating herself, she prayed, "Good Lord, I beg you: defend those I cannot protect." When Clare raised the ciborium, the soldiers scattered. Clare died in 1253 and was canonized only two years later.

### St. Jane Frances de Chantal - Wednesday, Aug. 12

Jane was married at twenty. After the untimely death of her husband, she retreated into prayer and caring for her four children. St. Jane Frances and St. Frances de Sales founded the Order of the Visitation.

### St. Maximilian Kolbe - Friday, August 14

Maximilian Kolbe was born in Russian Poland to a young laborer and his wife in 1894. At the age of ten, Mary appeared to him and offered him two crowns: red, for martyrdom, or white, for purity. He chose both. As a young Franciscan friar, his passion for Mary, his "Mamusia," was expressed in the Knights Immaculata, the movement of Marian consecration he zealously spread through a print apostolate. In February 1941, he was arrested by the Gestapo and eventually sent to Auschwitz. There he offered to take the place of a fellow prisoner sentenced to the starvation bunker. He died as a "martyr of charity" on August 14, 1941
