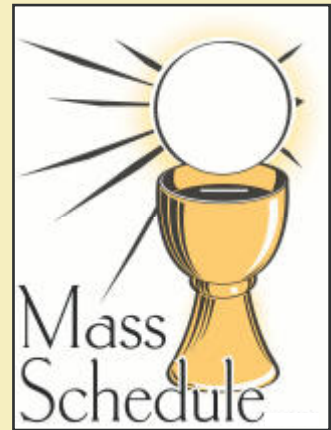

U.S. Bishops react to revival of federal death penalty

The Catholic Bishops of the United States express concern over the U.S. Justice Department's announcement scheduling the executions of five people on death row.

The last time the U.S. federal government executed someone was 16 years ago. Over the past two decades, an informal moratorium on the death penalty at the national level in the United States has seen the annual number of death sentences decrease by 85%.

Justice Department announcement

On Friday, U.S. Attorney General William Barr, announced that five death-row inmates would be executed by lethal injection within the next six months. "We owe it to the victims and their families to carry forward the sentence imposed by our justice system", he said.

Catholic Bishops' reaction

The Chairman of the USCCB Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development is Bishop Frank Dewane of Florida. In a statement reacting to Mr Barr's decision, he said the Catholic Bishops of the United States are "deeply concerned" by the move and urge the Trump Administration to reconsider.

Pope Francis and the death penalty

"In 2015 Pope Francis, echoing the views of his predecessors, called for 'the global abolition of the death penalty'", reads the statement. At that time, the Pope added that a "just and necessary punishment must never exclude the dimension of hope and the goal of rehabilitation".

In August last year, Pope Francis made a formal change to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, declaring the death penalty to be "inadmissible" and describing it as "an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person".

U.S. Catholic Bishops and the death penalty

In 2005, the United States Catholic Bishops Conference issued a statement echoing the position of the popes and the catechism, and entitled "A Culture of Life and the Penalty of Death". "In light of these long held and strongly maintained positions", says Bishop Dewane, "I am deeply concerned by the announcement of the United States Justice Department that it will once again turn, after many years, to the death penalty as a form of punishment, and urge that these federal officials be moved by God's love, which is stronger than death, and abandon the announced plans for executions".

According to Amnesty International, 170 countries have already abolished the death penalty in law or in practice, while Pope Francis continues to call for the Church to work "with determination for its abolition worldwide".

Los obispos de EE. UU. reaccionan ante la reactivación de la pena de muerte federal

Los obispos católicos de los Estados Unidos expresan preocupación por el anuncio del Departamento de Justicia de los Estados Unidos que programa las ejecuciones de cinco personas en el corredor de la muerte.

La última vez que el gobierno federal de los Estados Unidos ejecutó a alguien fue hace 16 años. En las últimas dos décadas, en una moratoria informal sobre la pena de muerte a nivel nacional en los Estados Unidos, el número anual de condenas a muerte disminuyó en un 85%.

Anuncio del Departamento de Justicia

El viernes, el fiscal general de los Estados Unidos, William Barr, anunció que cinco presos condenados a muerte serían ejecutados por inyección letal dentro de los próximos seis meses. "Le debemos a las víctimas y sus familias llevar adelante la sentencia impuesta por nuestro sistema de justicia", dijo.

Reacción de los obispos católicos

El presidente del Comité de Justicia Doméstica y Desarrollo Humano de USCCB es el Obispo Frank Dewane de Florida. En una declaración en respuesta a la decisión de Barr, dijo que los obispos católicos de los Estados Unidos están "profundamente preocupados" por la medida e instan a la Administración Trump a que reconsidere.

Papa Francisco y la pena de muerte

"En 2015, el Papa Francisco, haciendo eco de las opiniones de sus predecesores, pidió" la abolición global de la pena de muerte """, se lee en el comunicado. En ese momento, el Papa agregó que "un castigo justo y necesario nunca debe excluir la dimensión de la esperanza y el objetivo de la rehabilitación".

En agosto del año pasado, el Papa Francisco hizo un cambio formal al Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, declarando que la pena de muerte era "inadmisible" y describiéndola como "un ataque contra la inviolabilidad y la dignidad de la persona".

Obispos católicos de EE. UU. y la pena de muerte

En 2005, la Conferencia de los Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos emitió una declaración en eco de la posición de los papas y el catecismo, titulada "Una cultura de la vida y la pena de muerte". "A la luz de estas posiciones mantenidas y fuertemente mantenidas", dice el obispo Dewane, "estoy profundamente preocupado por el anuncio del Departamento de Justicia de los Estados Unidos de que, una vez más, recurrirá a la pena de muerte como forma castigo e insto a que estos funcionarios federales sean conmovidos por el amor de Dios, que es más fuerte que la muerte, y que abandonen los planes anunciados para las ejecuciones ". Según Amnistía Internacional, 170 países ya han abolido la pena de muerte en la ley o en la práctica, mientras que el Papa Francisco sigue pidiendo a la Iglesia que trabaje "con determinación para su abolición en todo el mundo".

Leading Them Home

A parent's most challenging leadership role is in the home. Here are some tips.



Be a good listener.

Look your child in the eye, and don't try to do something else at the same time. Don't interrupt. Resist the urge to finish your children's thoughts, but help them voice opinions and complicated concepts, as needed.

Look for times to talk.

Good times occur in the car, at bath time, at the dinner table, after a bedtime story, during picnics, on a walk, while shopping or playing a game.

Show respect and good example.

Communicate with your children with the same consideration you use with adults. Be interested, caring, polite, thoughtful and patient. Allow for questions about truth and morality. When you're wrong, apologize. This teaches children that you respect them and that making a mistake isn't fatal.

Say these words out loud and often - "I love you"; "You're special"; I'm proud of you."

Remind your child that he or she is uniquely made by God, given special gifts and talents to make a real difference in the world. Your child needs to hear that message, more than any other.

Este dogma fue proclamado por el Papa Pío XII, el 1º de noviembre de 1950.

Un dogma es una

verdad de fe, revelada por Dios (en la Sagrada Escritura o contenida en la Tradición), y que además es propuesta por la Iglesia como realmente revelada por Dios.

Veamos que dice el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica: #966 - *"La Asunción de la Santísima Virgen constituye una participación singular en la Resurrección de su Hijo y una anticipación de la resurrección de los demás cristianos".*

"Finalmente, la Virgen Inmaculada, preservada libre de toda mancha de pecado original, terminado el curso de su vida en la tierra, fue llevada a la gloria del cielo y elevada al trono del Señor como Reina del Universo, para ser conformada más plenamente a su Hijo, Señor de los señores y vencedor del pecado y de la muerte".

El Poderoso ha hecho obras grandes por mí.

La vida de María es un canto de alabanza a la grandeza del Señor. La mejor manera de celebrar las fiestas de María es alabar a Dios por todas las cosas buenas que ha hecho Dios. Nosotros, siempre débiles e imperfectos, hacemos cosas buenas porque Dios actúa en nosotros con su poder, su gracia y su fuerza. Alabemos a Dios por ello.
