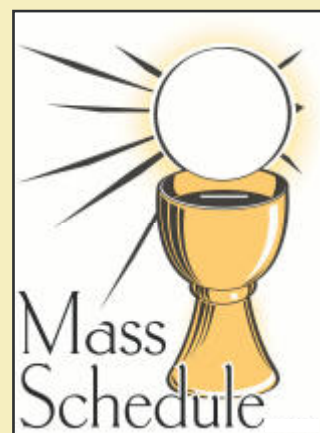

!The Season of Creation !

‘LAUDATO SI’, mi’ Signore!’ – ‘Praise be to you, my Lord.’

(usccb.org)

These are the words that open **Pope Francis’ encyclical** on care for God’s creation. These words, quoting a beautiful canticle of St. Francis of Assisi, remind us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us.

Pope Francis addresses his letter, *Laudato Si’: On Care of Our Common Home*, to “every person on the planet.” Because we all share a common home—the earth.

The Pope focuses on these important themes:

- + ***This is a moral and spiritual challenge.*** The ecological crisis, Pope Francis writes, is a summons to profound interior conversion—to renew our relationships with God, one another, and the created world.
- + ***We must each take care of God’s Creation now.*** God created the world and entrusted it to us as a gift. Now we have the responsibility to care for and protect it and all people, who are part of creation. Protecting human dignity is strongly linked to care for creation.
- + ***We are all connected.*** To each other, to the rest of the human family, to the world God created, and to all those who will come after us in the future—our great-great-great grandchildren.
- + ***This will impact the poor first.*** People in poverty have less to contribute to climate change, and yet they are more affected by it. As a result of excessive use of natural resources by wealthy nations, those who are poor experience more pollution, a greater lack of access to clean water, increased hunger, substandard dwellings often close to rising seas or polluted air, and more.
- + ***We are all called to solidarity.*** We are one human family and have a shared responsibility for others and for creation. Wealthy countries have a responsibility to reduce consumption of non-renewal resources and should help poorer nations develop in sustainable ways. Together we stand, divided we fall.
- + ***Technological and economic development should be balanced.*** They must serve human beings and enhance human dignity, instead of creating an economy of exclusion, so that all people have access to what is needed for authentic human development.
- + ***We must protect and support life in all of Creation.*** Failure to protect vulnerable human beings, such as unborn children, people with disabilities, or victims of human trafficking, is incompatible with concern for nature.
- + ***Now is the time to act.*** Pope Francis calls us to make a change in our lifestyle and our consumption. We can make important changes as individuals, families, and communities, and as civil and political leaders.
- + ***We must live in hope and joy.*** “Injustice is not invincible” (no. 74) and we act knowing that we seek to live out God’s vision of renewed relationships with God, within ourselves, with one another, and with Creation.

How can YOU respond? Each of us are called to take concrete steps – from reducing food waste and refusing plastic, which ends up in our water supply, to asking our neighbors and our politicians to please help take good care of God’s Creation.

Laudato Si': Sobre el cuidado de la casa común

“Alabado seas, mi Señor.” Estas son las palabras que abren la encíclica del **Papa Francisco** sobre la ecología y el cuidado de la creación de Dios. Estas palabras, que citan el hermoso cántico de san Francisco de Asís, nos recuerdan que nuestra casa común es como una hermana con quien compartimos nuestra vida y una hermosa madre que abre sus brazos para acogernos.

El papa Francisco dirige *Laudato Si'* a “cada persona que habita este planeta,” para que todos compartamos una casa común: la tierra. Se centra en una serie de temas importantes.

+ **Un desafío moral y espiritual.** La crisis ecológica, escribe el papa Francisco, es una invocación a una profunda conversión interior: a renovar nuestras relaciones con Dios, entre nosotros y con el mundo creado.

+ **Cuidado de la creación de Dios.** Dios creó el mundo y lo confió a nosotros como un don. Ahora tenemos la responsabilidad de cuidar y proteger a él y a todas las personas, que son parte de la creación. Proteger la dignidad humana está fuertemente ligado a cuidar de la creación.

+ **Todos estamos conectados.** Estamos conectados con el resto de la familia humana, con el mundo creado, y con los que vendrán después de nosotros en las generaciones futuras.

+ **Impacto en los pobres.** Las personas en situación de pobreza son las que menos han contribuido al cambio climático, y sin embargo se ven desproporcionadamente impactadas por este. Como resultado del uso excesivo de los recursos naturales por los países ricos, los pobres sufren contaminación, falta de acceso al agua potable, hambre y otros padecimientos.

+ **Llamados a la solidaridad.** Somos una sola familia humana y tenemos una responsabilidad compartida por los demás y por la creación. Los países ricos tienen la responsabilidad de reducir el consumo de recursos no renovables y deben ayudar a las naciones más pobres a desarrollarse de manera sostenible.

+ **El desarrollo tecnológico y económico** debe servir a los seres humanos y acrecentar la dignidad humana, en lugar de crear una economía de la exclusión, de modo que todas las personas tengan acceso a lo que se necesita para un auténtico desarrollo humano.

+ **Apoyar la vida, proteger la creación.** La preocupación por la naturaleza es incompatible con la falta de protección a los seres humanos vulnerables, como los niños no nacidos, las personas discapacitadas o las víctimas de la trata de personas.

+ **Es hora de actuar. El papa Francisco insta a un cambio en el estilo de vida y el consumo. Podemos hacer cambios importantes** como individuos, familias y comunidades, así como líderes civiles y políticos.

+ **Esperanza y alegría.** “La injusticia no es invencible” (no. 74), y actuamos sabiendo que buscamos vivir la visión de Dios de relaciones renovadas con él, con nosotros mismos, entre nosotros y con la creación.

Gifts from Bethlehem

A Traditional Art and Livelihood for Holy Land Christians

The handicrafts trade evolved as a cultural tradition of Christians in the Holy Land for many centuries. This

indigenous form of art has since become an industry of great importance to the local people of the Holy Land who rely on it for livelihood, and to Christian pilgrims from all around the world whose holy pilgrimage can be memorialized for a lifetime in cherished olive wood or mother of pearl souvenirs. The olive wood carving market is the major source of income in the Bethlehem area. More than 65 percent of the income of the community in Bethlehem comes from this work. In recent years, however, the holy crafts trade has suffered many hardships due to social and economical pressures. Because of a sharp fall in tourism and also as a result of diminishing numbers of craftsmen who leave their traditional trade and emigrate due to the difficult conditions in their homeland, the Holy Land handicraft market is facing serious danger, and so is the Christian community in the Land. Sixty five years ago the Christians represented more than 28% of the total population in the Holy Land, today they are less than 1.5%. The loss of Christians in the land of Christianity's birth will represent a tragedy of immeasurable proportions for the billions of Christians worldwide.

Thank you for your vital support for a Christian tradition and in protecting this very important culture and industry.
