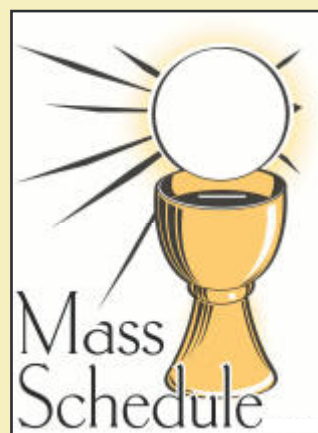
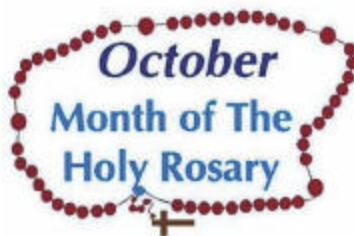

POPE FRANCIS TO YOUNG PEOPLE AND TO THE ENTIRE PEOPLE OF GOD ABOUT MARY, THE YOUNG WOMAN OF NAZARETH (CHRISTUS VIVIT - POST-SYNODAL APOSTOLIC EXHORTATION)



In the heart of the Church, Mary shines forth. She is the supreme model for a youthful Church that seeks to follow Christ with enthusiasm and docility. While still very young, she accepted the message of the angel, yet she was not afraid to ask questions (cf. *Lk 1:34*). With open heart and soul, she replied, “Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord” (*Lk 1:38*).

“We are always struck by the strength of the young Mary’s ‘yes’, the strength in those words, ‘be it done’, that she spoke to the angel. This was no merely passive or resigned acceptance, or a faint ‘yes’, as if to say, ‘Well, let’s give it a try and see what happens’. Mary did not know the words, ‘Let’s see what happens’. She was determined; she knew what was at stake and she said ‘yes’ without thinking twice. Hers was the ‘yes’ of someone prepared to be committed, someone willing to take a risk, ready to stake everything she had, with no more security than the certainty of knowing that she was the bearer of a

promise. So I ask each one of you: do you see yourselves as the bearers of a promise? What promise is present in my heart that I can take up? Mary’s mission would undoubtedly be difficult, but the challenges that lay ahead were no reason to say ‘no’. Things would get complicated, of course, but not in the same way as happens when cowardice paralyzes us because things are not clear or sure in advance. Mary did not take out an insurance policy! She took the risk, and for this reason she is strong, she is an ‘influencer’, the ‘influencer’ of God. Her ‘yes and her desire to serve were stronger than any doubts or difficulties”.

Without yielding to evasions or illusions, “she accompanied the suffering of her Son; she supported him by her gaze and protected him with her heart. She shared his suffering, yet was not overwhelmed by it. She was the woman of strength who uttered her ‘yes’, who supports and accompanies, protects and embraces. She is the great guardian of hope... From her, we learn how to say ‘yes’ to the stubborn endurance and creativity of those who, undaunted, are ever ready to start over again”.

Mary was a young woman whose heart overflowed with joy (cf. *Lk 1:47*), whose eyes, reflecting the light of the Holy Spirit, looked at life with faith and treasured all things in her youthful heart (cf. *Lk 2:19.51*). She was energetic, ready to set out immediately once she knew that her cousin needed her. She did not think about her own plans, but went “with haste” to the hill country (*Lk 1:39*).

When her young son needed protection, Mary set out with Joseph to a distant land (cf. *Mt 2:13-14*). She also joined the disciples in awaiting the outpouring of the Holy Spirit (cf. *Acts 1:14*). In her presence, a young Church was born, as the apostles went forth to give birth to a new world (cf. *Acts 2:4-11*).

Today, Mary is the Mother who watches over us, her children, on our journey through life, often weary and in need, anxious that the light of hope not fail. For that is our desire: that the light of hope never fail. Mary our Mother looks to this pilgrim people: a youthful people whom she loves, and who seek her in the silence of their hearts amid all the noise, the chatter and the distractions of the journey. Under the gaze of our Mother, there is room only for the silence of hope. Thus Mary illumines anew our youth.

PAPA FRANCISCO A LOS JÓVENES Y A TODAS LAS PERSONAS DE DIOS ACERCA DE MARÍA, LA MUCHACHA DE NAZARETH (CRISTO VIVITO - EXHORTACIÓN APOSTÓLICA POSTSINODOAL)



En el corazón de la Iglesia resplandece María. Ella es el gran modelo para una Iglesia joven, que quiere seguir a Cristo con frescura y docilidad. Cuando era muy joven, recibió el anuncio del ángel y no se privó de hacer preguntas (cf. *Lc 1,34*). Pero tenía un alma disponible y dijo: «Aquí está la servidora del Señor» (*Lc 1,38*).

Siempre llama la atención la fuerza del “sí” de María joven. La fuerza de ese “hágase” que le dijo al ángel. Fue una cosa distinta a una aceptación pasiva o resignada. Fue algo distinto a un “sí” como diciendo: bueno, vamos a probar a ver qué pasa. María no conocía esa expresión: vamos a ver qué pasa. Era decidida, supo de qué se trataba y dijo “sí”, sin vueltas. Fue algo más, fue algo distinto. Fue el “sí” de quien quiere comprometerse y el que quiere arriesgar, de quien quiere apostar todo, sin más

seguridad que la certeza de saber que era portadora de una promesa. Y yo pregunto a cada uno de ustedes. ¿Se sienten portadores de una promesa? ¿Qué promesa tengo en el corazón para llevar adelante? María tendría, sin dudas, una misión difícil, pero las dificultades no eran una razón para decir “no”. Seguro que tendría complicaciones, pero no serían las mismas complicaciones que se producen cuando la cobardía nos paraliza por no tener todo claro o asegurado de antemano. ¡María no compró un seguro de vida! ¡María se la jugó y por eso es fuerte, por eso es una *influencer*, es la *influencer* de Dios! El “sí” y las ganas de servir fueron más fuertes que las dudas y las dificultades».

Sin ceder a evasiones ni espejismos, «ella supo acompañar el dolor de su Hijo [...] sostenerlo en la mirada, cobijarlo con el corazón. Dolor que sufrió, pero no la resignó. Fue la mujer fuerte del “sí”, que sostiene y acompaña, cobija y abraza. Ella es la gran custodia de la esperanza [...]. De ella aprendemos a decir “sí” en la testaruda paciencia y creatividad de aquellos que no se achican y vuelven a comenzar».

María era la chica de alma grande que se estremecía de alegría (cf. *Lc 1,47*), era la jovencita con los ojos iluminados por el Espíritu Santo que contemplaba la vida con fe y guardaba todo en su corazón de muchacha (cf. *Lc 2,19.51*). Era la inquieta, la que se pone continuamente en camino, que cuando supo que su prima la necesitaba no pensó en sus propios proyectos, sino que salió hacia la montaña «sin demora» (*Lc 1,39*).

Y si hacía falta proteger a su niño, allá iba con José a un país lejano (cf. *Mt 2,13-14*). Por eso permaneció junto a los discípulos reunidos en oración esperando al Espíritu Santo (cf. *Hch 1,14*). Así, con su presencia, nació una Iglesia joven, con sus Apóstoles en salida para hacer nacer un mundo nuevo (cf. *Hch 2,4-11*).

Aquella muchacha hoy es la Madre que vela por los hijos, estos hijos que caminamos por la vida muchas veces cansados, necesitados, pero queriendo que la luz de la esperanza no se apague. Eso es lo que queremos: que la luz de la esperanza no se apague. Nuestra Madre mira a este pueblo peregrino, pueblo de jóvenes querido por ella, que la busca haciendo silencio en el corazón aunque en el camino haya mucho ruido, conversaciones y distracciones. Pero ante los ojos de la Madre sólo cabe el silencio esperanzado. Y así María ilumina de nuevo nuestra juventud.

Envelope System - To assist us in keeping accurate records of your contributions, we request that you use the weekly envelope system. This enables us to verify your donations should it be necessary for tax purposes. Please notify the Rectory if you change your address.
