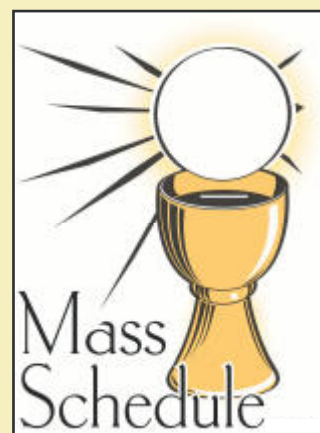

A Letter from St. Frances Xavier Cabrini Patron Saint of Immigrants 1850-1917

“I know that this is a time of much anxiety. But, away with anxiety; take courage! Place your trust in God and His Holy Mother...

Prayer is that powerful weapon that must defend and help you, not only now, but throughout your lives. Pray for yourselves, for the persons entrusted to your care, for those dear to you, for society, for the Church. Make prayer a habit, because if you succeed in experiencing the sweetness found in this intimate conversation of the soul with God, there will never be hours of discouragement and despair, no will clouds long disturb the calm horizon of your soul. Obey Christ’s precept: pray and always pray.” (New Orleans, May 31, 1904)

From the Pastoral Letter to the People of God in El Paso by Mark Joseph Seitz, Bishop of El Paso October 13, 2019

“The burden of the history of injustice on the border is heavy. We must wrestle deeply with this legacy, lament over it passionately, confront our own biases candidly and repudiate racism completely. God offers us the chance to build a new history where racism does not prevail. The ‘manifesto’ of hate and exclusion that entered our community can be countered with a manifesto of radical love and inclusion. I want to see an El Paso that addresses both the legacy of racism and one which builds more just structures to eradicate and overcome that history. A new history of respect for human rights, inclusion and bridge building. The Reign of God is reflected in a community that brings together the best of all cultures, where the aspirations of all find a home and where the needs of the poor are put first. If we do this, we can make a vitally needed contribution to the nation from our border, here on the edges of empire, towards turning the page on injustice and hate and white supremacy definitively.” (60)

“God gave the earth to the whole human race for the sustenance of all its members, without excluding or favoring anyone. We must work to ensure all our children have access to quality educational opportunities, eliminate inequality in the *colonias*, pass immigration reform, eradicate discrimination, guarantee universal access to health care, ensure the protection of all human life, end the scourge of gun violence, improve wages on both sides of the border, offer just and sustainable development opportunities, defend the environment and honor the dignity of every person. This is how we write a new chapter in our history of solidarity and friendship that future generations can remember with pride. This work of undoing racism and building a just society is holy, for it ‘contributes to the building of the universal city of God, which is the goal of the history of the human family. It anticipates that day when ‘night will be no more, nor will they need light from lamp or sun, for the Lord God shall give them light, and they shall reign forever and ever.’ (61)

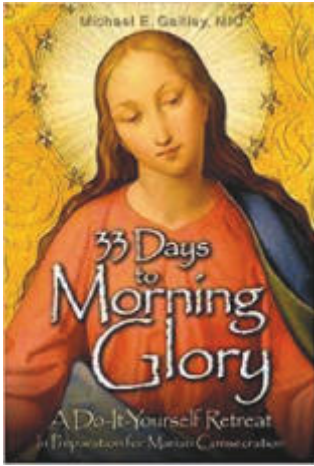
“Sé que este es un momento de mucha ansiedad. Pero, fuera con la ansiedad; Toma coraje! Pon tu confianza en Dios y en Su Santa Madre....

Esto me consuela porque la oración es esa poderosa arma que debe defender y ayudarte, no sólo ahora, sino a lo largo de tu vida. Es la llave de los tesoros celestiales, el canal por el cual descienden las gracias. En tiempo de éxito, ora y no estarás hinchado por el orgullo que a menudo precede a una caída. En tiempos de desánimo, ora, y la confianza que nos hace fuerte, con la fuerza de Dios volverá. Oren por ustedes mismos, por las personas confiadas en su cuidado, por sus seres queridos, por la sociedad, por la Iglesia. Haz de la oración un hábito, porque si logras experimentar la dulzura que se encuentra en esta íntima conversación del alma con Dios, nunca habrá horas de desánimo y desesperación, ni las nubes perturbarán por largo tiempo el tranquilo horizonte de tus almas. Obedezcan el precepto de Cristo: orar y orar siempre.” (New Orleans, Mayo 31, 1904)

De la Carta Pastoral para el Pueblo de Dios en El Paso por Mark Joseph Seitz, Obispo de El Paso Octubre 13, 2019

“La carga de la historia de la injusticia en la frontera es pesada. Debemos luchar profundamente con este legado, lamentarlo apasionadamente, enfrentar nuestros prejuicios con franqueza y repudiar completamente el racismo. Dios nos ofrece la oportunidad de construir una nueva historia donde el racismo no prevalezca. El *manifiesto* de odio y exclusión que ingresó a nuestra comunidad se puede contrarrestar con un *manifiesto de amor radical*. Quiero ver un El Paso que aborde tanto, el legado del racismo como uno que construya estructuras más justas para erradicar y superar esa historia. Una nueva historia de respeto por los derechos humanos, la inclusión y la construcción de puentes. El Reino de Dios se refleja en una comunidad que reúne lo mejor de todas las culturas, donde las aspiraciones de todos encuentren un hogar y donde las necesidades de los pobres se ponen primero. Si hacemos esto, podemos hacer una contribución vitalmente necesaria a la nación desde nuestra frontera, desde aquí al borde del imperio, y pasar definitivamente la página de la injusticia, el odio y la supremacía blanca.” (60)

«Dios ha dado la tierra a todo el género humano para que ella sustente a todos sus habitantes, sin excluir a nadie ni privilegiar a ninguno». Debemos trabajar para garantizar que todos nuestros niños tengan acceso a oportunidades educativas de calidad, eliminar la desigualdad en las colonias, aprobar la reforma migratoria, erradicar la discriminación, garantizar el acceso universal a la atención médica, garantizar la protección de toda la vida humana, poner fin al flagelo de la violencia armada, mejorar los salarios en ambos lados de la frontera, ofrecer oportunidades de desarrollo justas y sostenibles, defender el medio ambiente y honrar la dignidad de cada persona. Así es como escribimos un nuevo capítulo en nuestra historia de solidaridad y amistad que las generaciones futuras podrán recordar con orgullo. Este trabajo de deshacer el racismo y construir una sociedad justa es sagrado, ya que «contribuye a la edificación de esa ciudad de Dios universal hacia la cual avanza la historia de la familia humana». Anticipa el día en que *noche ya no habrá; no tendrán necesidad de luz de lámpara ni de luz del sol, porque el Señor Dios los alumbrará y reinarán por los siglos de los siglos.*” (61)
