EASTER 2016...

Easter dawns this year amidst the backdrop of recent terror events in Belgium. There are families this Easter mourning the death of loved ones so suddenly taken from them through violence and hatred. What do Christians, like us, who are celebrating Easter, have to say about these events and to such families? This is the challenge of Easter right before us today. Easter challenges us to believe in Jesus who walked among us and was suddenly and cruelly take from us on the cross. His death for people of faith has great meaning and gives us hope that no matter how bad others might treat us and hate us and persecute us Jesus does not forget us. He said to the repentant thief who only asked to be "remembered" "This day – you will be with me in paradise." Jesus does not forget those whom he died for on the cross. Jesus died on the cross for the sins of humankind including the grave injustices of our day. Easter challenges us to be hopeful for we carry with us the promise of Jesus that in the end his way will conquer all evil. The proclamation of Easter joy may not heal the broken hearts of those who have lost loved ones this week, but we can pray for them, that the power of Jesus' promise given through his resurrection will strengthen them now. Easter reminds us that when the disciples felt everything was lost there was a promise of new life with Jesus that would last forever. The color green was no longer available as a standard color so we went with the burgundy. After 30 years I guess it was time for a change even among the chair makers. We will deposit the money in a separate fund until we have enough to cover the cost of an additional 60 chairs.
