ISAIAH 42:1-3 Messiah brings forth justice...

"Behold, My Servant, whom I uphold; My chosen one in whom My soul delights I have put My Spirit upon Him; He will bring forth justice to the nations. "He will not cry out or raise His voice, Nor make His voice heard in the street. "A bruised reed He will not break And a dimly burning wick He will not extinguish; He will faithfully bring forth justice.

These words of Isaiah written long ago are understood by Christians to be a description of the Messiah who was to come into the world. Jesus the messiah was to bring justice not by violence but through his gentle and unselfish love. As his disciples we are called to imitate him. YEAR OF MERCY --- POPE FRANCIS
