EASTER 2017 – April 16

I recently found myself reflecting on a lot of experiences and people who have been in my life going back many years. I think, as I look forward to retirement in a couple of months, I am having these memories come to me sort of as security for things to come. These memories assuring me that even though I will have different experiences and new people in my life when I retire, I will have just as rewarding ones as in the past. One of these experiences was remembering how each Easter my extended family always gathered in Eastside Park in Paterson and had a picture taken in front of some great big flowering tree. I am not sure I made the picture the year I was born because Easter was April 6, 1947 and I was only 12 days old and in those days no one took a child out of the house until it was baptized. Memories of Easter that were preserved in pictures over years brought a sense of continuity.

The point of the message today is - we need to celebrate Easter each year with our Christian family in the world so that we continue the continuity of the message of Easter. The heart of the message is that Jesus is our Risen Lord and no matter what changes in our lives from year to year, the power of the Risen Lord is what continues to fill our lives with meaning and purpose. Easter is our most important feast day and just like yearly photos in families, it is important to celebrate it again to remind ourselves of who we are a God's people. We are God's people because Jesus fulfilled his promise to suffer, die and rise again and promises us the same hope that we will live with him forever.

WHY WE ARE CATHOLIC...

We are Catholic because we believe:

The first element we encounter in the framework of the Easter events is the empty tomb. In itself, it is not a direct proof of Resurrection; the absence of Christ's body from the tomb could be explained otherwise. [493] Nonetheless, the empty tomb was still an essential sign for all. Its discovery by the disciples was the first step toward recognizing the very fact of the Resurrection. This was the case, first with the holy women, and then with Peter. [494] the disciple "whom Jesus loved," affirmed that when he entered the empty tomb and discovered "the linen cloths lying there", "he saw and believed". [495] this suggests that he realized from the empty tomb's condition that the absence of Jesus' body could not have been of human doing and that Jesus had not simply returned to earthly life as had been the case with Lazarus. EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

In this passage, Peter testifies that he and his followers saw the miracles performed by Christ, witnessed His death, and believe in His resurrection. Now they will proclaim to all that Christ is the Son of God.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Paul tells the Colossians that they will appear with Christ in glory. They should be mindful of things above rather than things on earth.

Gospel: John 20:1-9

In vivid detail, John tells us that when Mary Magdalene visited Christ's tomb, the tomb was empty. She told the apostles, who ran to the tomb, and saw the "wrappings" on the ground. The disciple who entered first "saw and believed."
