MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND 2017...

Waterloo, NY is credited with the first celebrations of Memorial Day. This town in NY State first celebrated the day on May 5, 1866. Dear Parishioners of St. Mark's,

I am ending my time as pastor of St. Mark's on June 29th. Fr. Marcin Michalowski will be the new pastor as of this date. I wanted to give you a brief summary of where we have been financially in conjunction with the 3rd quarter report you will find in the bulletin.

Over all St. Mark's has always been struggling to make ends meet. The report you see today has a negative balance but that was before we received the Easter Collection and other donations. As of today we are a little ahead. Those of you who have read these reports I have printed in the bulletin over the years know that it is somewhat like the proverbial "roller-coaster ride" during the years.

2007 - I was appointed pastor on June 13, 2007. During that year I met with the parish finance board members and parish advisory board members to learn more about the financial picture of the parish. Bishop's annual appeal \$10,000 goal is met and pledges are higher so 50% overage back to the parish is helpful.

2008 – A little over a year since I was pastor we had the financial meltdown in U.S. which hit everyone in different ways. The effect on St. Mark's was that parishioners became more financially cautious. This effected the weekly collections to a noticeable degree. In the late fall I formed a committee of the '20" as it was known. This was a committee of twenty parishioners including finance board members, Parish Advisory Board Members, and other parishioners. I made a presentation about what was happening with our finances and what solutions we might undertake. Thanks to their input we were able to prepare a parish presentation in January 2009.

2009 - January presentation to parish on drop off in contributions. We pointed out the need to have a regular income that we can count on in order to meet our expenses. At this time we asked parishioners to please trust God in giving each week and we ask them to increase their offering to past levels if they decreased. We also instituted the On Line Giving program for our parish and thankfully many parishioners joined it initially and we also enhanced the knowledge about our food gift card program as a means of continual support of the parish.

2010 – During this year I was in discussions with the financial CFO of our diocese about somehow reducing the past existing debt to the diocese. Our parish participated in a study by a diocesan committee who met with us concerning our financial situation.

2011* - I was appointed pastor of Our Lady of the Mountain on July 1st. Part of the reason for the decision to have one pastor for two parishes was due to the financial situation of St. Mark's. In order to try to help the parish it was determined that 40% of my pastor's salary etc. would be paid by St. Mark's and 60% by OLM. This is still in effect today. Also part of the agreement was to sell the house on Ann Road where the St. Marks pastor lived and the profits from the house sale would be applied to outstanding assessments to the diocese.

2012 – During this year in continuing talks with the diocese it was determined that if St. Mark's remained current on it payments to the diocese for benefits, assessments etc. The past debt would be forgiven. The debt was forgiven and we have managed to stay current although at times it has been tight.

2013 - Partners in Faith campaign – this campaign conducted by members of the parish committee was very successful to help the major effort of the diocese to have funds to invest for long range projects. The agreement with most parishes in the diocese was that 25% of the overage of the parish goal once reached would be turned over to the parish. However St. Mark's agreement reached was that 50% of the overage would be turned over each year when the payments were received provided that we applied the 50% to our church mortgage. We have done that.

2014, 2015, 2016- These three years saw us trying to manage each month. We have never fallen behind on the mortgage. The mortgage taken out on the church was \$1,000,000 (1 Million). The loan from the bank is a 25 year loan. There are ten (10) years left on paying off the mortgage. The current balance is \$389,540.73. Every 5 years the interest rate on the loan is adjusted according to the 10 year Treasury note. This will happen again in June of 2018.

2017 – Early this year you received information on the parish increased offertory campaign, "Moving Forward with Faith" --- this parish campaign grew out of a diocesan survey of weekly collections from all parishes over the past three years. The results were that most parishes had a decrease in collections or were static. The diocese suggested that an increase offertory campaign would be helpful to the parish and thus through Our Sunday Visitor we conducted this beginning in February. The results have been good. You should have recently received a report on this.

As I prepare to leave I just urge you to be faithful to the regular collections, use on line giving and be supportive of Fr. Marcin Michalowski as he begins his pastorate among you. I only have best wishes and prayers that St. Mark's continues on a good financial path in the future. Fr. Joe
