HOW GOOD ARE THE SAINTS?

I believe that praying to the saints for various things is important. Our church has a number of saints that are associated with all aspects of our life. We can intercede for help, health, protection and many other things. St. Jude is famous as the saint for hopeless causes. St. Joseph my patron is the patron Saint of the Church. If you ask my staff they will tell you we have often prayed to St. Anthony – the saint who helps us find things we lost. During my years at St. Mark's I have managed to lose a good number of items. Just recently we had a search on and prayers being offered to St. Anthony that I would find the backpack that I always carry with me that contains things pertinent to my parish work and personal information. Well I almost gave up but after three days I found it. It was on my bed! Preparing to pack up for my move, I put a few sweaters and other things on top of it and never looked under the pile of clothes that was accumulating on the bed.

I am thinking of St. Anthony this week for another reason also - it is his feast day on Tuesday, June 13 and it was on that day ten years ago I took up my ministry as Pastor at St. Mark's. Bishop Serratelli likes to assign priests on particular feast days. So ten years ago St. Anthony helped me find my way to St. Mark's. So prayer to the saints usually brings us good things. Whatever our need we have people-saints in heaven like ourselves who faced some similar difficulties and challenges in their lives. One time someone asked me if prayer to the Saints really works... my answer is simple it can't hurt. Just remember to say thank you when you find an answer to your prayer or in my case my backpack--- Fr. Joe

First Reading: Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9

The Lord appears to Moses on Mount Sinai and proclaims to him that he Lord is a "merciful God...slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity."

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

Paul exhorts the Corinthians to live in peace and harmony, and for the first time, invokes the Blessed Trinity.

Gospel: John 3:16-18

In this beautiful passage, Jesus tells Nicodemus that God loved his people so much that he "gave his only son." Jesus reveals to Nicodemus that anyone who believes in him will not die but will enjoy life with him for all eternity.
