### FROM FR. SLAWOMIR...

#### Alexander Men – September 7

Orthodox Priest and Martyr (1935-1990)

Alexander Men was born in Russia in the heart of the Stalinist era. Ordained an Orthodox priest in 1960, he spent most of his career in obscure pastoral assignments. Though subject, like all priests, to the threat of harassment and persecution, he was able to carve out a small zone of operation in the Moscow area. Through the 1970s he worked to establish small Christian communities which emphasized prayer and Bible study.

Gradually, he assumed a more visible role. Known as the “priest of the intellectuals” and a friend of dissidents, he was regularly picked up by the KGB for questioning. Yet he refused opportunities to leave the country. With the dawn of glasnost under Mikhail Gorbachev, Men was finally able to publish his spiritual writings and to offer public lectures on Christianity. Thus, he became a symbol of the resurgence of spiritual values. Not everyone welcomed this new era of openness. On September 9, 1990, unknown assailants struck him in the head with an ax as he was on his way to church. He died instantly. Men had anticipated such a fate. As he wrote to a friend before his death, “Do not be worried about me .... I’m only an instrument that God is using for the moment. Afterwards, things will be as God wants them.”

### FROM FR. JAVIER:

#### TEACHING FROM THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH - THE SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH

##### The sacraments of the Anointing of the Sick

My dear brothers and sisters, the risen Lord renews this *mission* (“*In my name . . . they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will recover.*”) and confirms it through the signs that the Church performs by invoking his name. These signs demonstrate in a special way that Jesus is truly “God who saves.”

The Holy Spirit gives to some a special charism of healing so as to make manifest the power of the grace of the risen Lord. But even the most intense prayers do not always obtain the healing of all illnesses.

Also, the Church has received this charge from the Lord and strives to carry it out by taking care of the sick as well as by accompanying them with her prayer of intercession. She believes in the life-giving presence of Christ, the physician of souls and bodies. This presence is particularly active through the sacraments, and in an altogether special way through the Eucharist, the bread that gives eternal life.

However, the apostolic Church has its own rite for the sick, attested to by St. James: “*Is any among you sick? Let him call for the priests of the Church and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise them up; and if they have committed sins, they will be forgiven.*” Tradition has recognized in this rite one of the seven sacraments.
