Easter is the celebration of Christ's resurrection from the dead. As we know from the Gospels, Jesus Christ rose from the dead on the third day following his crucifixion (which is Easter Sunday). No matter the length of time or the degree of that challenge, we see the light at the end if we are well rooted in our faith, embrace the cross, and believe in God's love and promise of everlasting life.

It is the resurrection of Jesus that gives us the internal flame and inspiration to know that He will be here to help us. In His Resurrection Christ offered us a new life filled with grace, hope and love. After all, in dying He destroyed our death, and in rising He restored our life.



The Paschal or Easter Candle




Each year at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday, a new fire is built and blessed. From this fire, a new Paschal Candle is lit for the first time and will be used for one year. Candle designs vary, but they are always white, the largest in the worship space and contain certain symbols - a cross, the Alpha and Omega and the date. Let's design our own candle by choosing, coloring and gluing on the designs you like. Do you see the Paschal Candle in your church?

- (1) THE CROSS Always the central symbol
- (2) THE ALPHA AND OMEGA Tells us God is the beginning and the end
- (3) THE CURRENT YEAR Says God is with us here and now
- (4) **THE FLAME** Reminds us Jesus is the Light of the World
- (5) Use **RED** to make 5 points on the cross to represent the 5 wounds of Jesus
