

## **CORPUS CHRISTI FOOD COLLECTION FOR THE POOR**



The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted those living in poverty the most and Catholic Charities, Diocese of Paterson's three food pantries (Father English Center, Paterson; Hope House, Dover; and Partnership of Social Services, Franklin) are giving out more food than ever before.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly The Most Holy Trinity June 7, 2020

"Having come down in a cloud, the Lord stood with Moses there and proclaimed his name, 'Lord.' Thus the Lord passed before him and cried out, 'The Lord, the Lord, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity.' Moses then bowed down to the ground in worship. Then he said, 'If I find favor with you O Lord, do come along in our company."

How exciting is the description of Moses' encounter with God. He reveals His name and we discover the attributes of God – mercy, graciousness, kindly and faithful. It is no surprise that there is an invitation to accompany his people on their journey.

It is the gift of accompaniment which continues with us as we encounter our God. The same characteristics from the book of Exodus, are the driving force for us to grow in holiness. As God revealed Himself to Moses He manifests Himself to us, for 'God so loved the world He gave His only Son.'

### THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

### First Reading: Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9

The Lord appears to Moses on Mount Sinai and proclaims to him that he Lord is a "merciful God...slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity."

### Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

Paul exhorts the Corinthians to live in peace and harmony, and for the first time, invokes the Blessed Trinity.

#### **Gospel: John 3:16-18**

In this beautiful passage, Jesus tells Nicodemus that God loved his people so much that he "gave his only son." Jesus reveals to Nicodemus that anyone who believes in him will not die but will enjoy life with him for all eternity.

During this unprecedented time when we are unable to attend Mass and participate together in parish events due to measures taken by our diocese to halt the spread of the coronavirus, we are going to try to keep all of you updated on latest developments by posting our bulletin each weekend on our website, <a href="stmonicasussex.org">stmonicasussex.org</a>.

The parish office is closed until further notice. Voice mail and email messages will be monitored as often as possible. Mass cards may be requested by leaving a message at the church office. We will continue to prepare a bulletin to keep you updated with any news.

## **IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT**

In anticipation of Churches opening soon, please go to the home page of St. Monica's website, and read the letter from the Bishop which contains the mandatory restrictions that have been imposed by the Diocese of Paterson under the guidelines of the CDC. By being mindful of these restrictions, you will be better prepared when our doors open again.

When the time comes to reopen St. Monica's, we need to clarify some of the guidelines: As you can see, we must restrict attendance at each Mass to 25% of capacity. Parishioners will be admitted by the side door only. Face masks are required. Hand disinfectant will be provided at the door. Attendance will be on a first-come, first-served basis until 25% capacity is reached for each Mass. Alternate pews will be marked and kept vacant in order to observe social distancing. Ushers will be available to assist you at weekend Masses.

Mass times (Summer schedule) will be as follows:

Saturdays 5:00 pm

Sundays 8:30 am and 10:30 am (<u>no</u> 12 noon Mass) Weekdays (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday): 9:00 am

We are hopeful that we will be able to worship together again in the very near future. We thank you for your anticipated adherence to the restrictions and we understand that they will place many constraints on our Mass participation, but we must be compliant to the guidelines. We greatly miss each and every one of you and look forward to seeing you again soon.

For now, we must remain closed, but until we receive word on when we can reopen, may God bless each and every one of you.
