

St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Parish (College Station) to Host the Fatima Centennial U.S. Tour for Peace

The world-famous International Pilgrim Virgin Statue, traveling worldwide for nearly 70 years, is on an historic U.S. Tour for Peace for the Fatima Centennial, and is coming to our diocese.

The tour is visiting 140 dioceses in all 50 states through December 2017. It is an extraordinary occasion of healing, hope, and grace for our country and our parish.

The statue has been traveling worldwide since 1947 when it left Fatima and first came to the United States. It was blessed by the Bishop of Leiria-Fatima, who prayed that Our Lady's presence would travel with it wherever it went. It was also blessed in 1952 by Pope Pius XII who had the original statue in Fatima crowned as Queen of the World just a few years earlier.

This epic journey across the United States is to allow Our Lady of Fatima, the Queen of Peace, to claim her dominion over our country and to bring the message of Fatima—the Peace Plan from heaven—to a world in need. Our Lord told Sister Lucia that he had placed the peace of the world in the Immaculate Heart.

The International Pilgrim Virgin Statue has visited more than 100 countries, bringing Mary's powerful message of salvation and hope to millions.

St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Parish will host the tour on December 9 from 8am-7pm. It will be an extraordinary occasion of healing, hope and grace. Please join us that day to hear the story of Fatima and venerate this beautiful statue that set out from Fatima in 1947 to bring the graces of Fatima to all who might not ever be able to make a pilgrimage to Fatima, Portugal.
