COVID-19 UPDATES

Pursuant to Bishop Vasquez' decree dated April 30, 2020, and with the recommendation of the governor's directives for houses of worship, parishes in the Diocese of Austin must follow these temporary protocols when celebrating the sacraments until further notice.

*Maintain 6-feet of distance.

*We advise and encourage the following parishioners to remain at home:

- those who are sick
- those who are 65 or older
- those who have been advised by health care workers or caregivers to not attend Mass
- those who sincerely believe that attending Mass will jeopardize their health
- those with pre-existing conditions

*We encourage the faithful to wear facemasks during liturgies. Masks are not required by the governor's order, but are recommended. (Church will not provide masks.)

*We will make every effort to disinfect pews and other regularly touched surfaces after each liturgy.

*We will use minimal entrances to help in managing the flow of parishioners.

*Parishioners should not congregate in the narthex after Mass.

*Communion received by hand remains the temporary expectation.
