



COVID-19 UPDATED PROTOCOLS JULY 1, 2020

Pursuant to Bishop Vasquez' decree dated April 30, 2020 parishes in the Diocese of Austin MUST follow these revised temporary protocols when celebrating the sacraments, until further notice. These revised protocols replace those published on May 29, 2020.

- Attendance at liturgies may not exceed 50% of full seating capacity of churches or buildings in which they are celebrated.
- Parishioners are encouraged to maintain safe distance between each other.
- These parishioners may remain at home to make a Spiritual Communion on a live stream of Mass: (i) those who are sick; (ii) those who are 65 or older; (iii) those who have been advised by health care workers or caregivers to not attend Mass; (iv) those who sincerely believe that attending Mass will jeopardize their health or the health of a person with whom they reside.
- Parishioners are encouraged to wear facemasks while on parish campuses.
- Parishioners are strongly encouraged to take Holy Communion in the hand (the species of bread), for the health of the priest and the whole community.

These temporary protocols apply to all liturgies and remain in effect until August 1.
