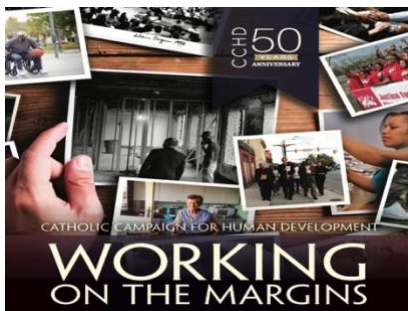
Announcements and Upcoming Events
