**Downtown** - 61, 68, 77, 78

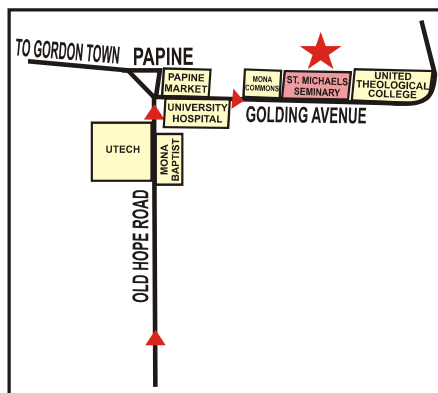
**Portmore** - 19A Express

## A CERTIFICATE PROGRAMME IN THEOLOGY

## Programme I

### Requirements

- ◆ The two year Laity Training Programme (including assessment of performance. Passing grade required)
- ◆ At least one course each semester
- ◆ 30 credits (10 courses)

### Courses:

Core courses which must be taken:

- ◆ Introduction to Old Testament Literature
- ◆ Introduction to New Testament Literature
- ◆ History of the Church from Pentecost to Charlemagne
- ◆ Introduction to Systematic Theology
- ◆ Introduction to Theological Ethics
- ◆ History of Christian Worship

The remaining 4 courses are to be chosen from the courses in Theology offered at St. Michael's Theological College.

Courses may include Distant Education Courses and Research Papers done under Supervision.

## Programme II

### Requirements

Minimum requirement 5 CXC subjects including English (general proficiency grades 1 – 3). With consideration given when there is less than 5 CXC passes to personal maturity and work experience.

- ◆ Applicants can begin the programme in either September or January

### To receive certification students must

- ◆ Earn 36 credits (12 x 3 credit course or a combination of 3 credit courses and modules)
- ◆ Attend at least one course per semester

### CORE COURSES

- ◆ Introduction to New Testament Literature
- ◆ History of the Church from Pentecost to Charlemagne
- ◆ Introduction to Systematic Theology
- ◆ Introduction to Theological Ethics
- ◆ Introduction to Christian Worship

- ◆ Foundations of Prayer
- ◆ Explorations in Spirituality
- ◆ The Holy Spirit and Discernment
- ◆ Themes in Spirituality
- ◆ Caribbean Spirituality
