

Supply list, grades 5 and 6

- 1 package of colored pencils (set of 8 or 12), labeled with your child's name
- 1 watercolor paint set labeled with your child's name
- 1 **small** pencil box or pouch to store 2 pencils, 2 pens, and one eraser. (Students will be assigned a drawer for extra pencils, pens, etc.)
- 3 or 4 erasers (Some students like to have cap erasers for when the eraser on the pencil wears down. You could also get a package or two of these if your students likes them.)
- 3 packages of mechanical pencils or Ticonderoga #2 pencils. (Does your child easily lose things? Send 4 packages. Is your child meticulous about caring for his or her things? Two packages will be enough.) Each pencil should be labeled with your child's name or initials on the side of the pencil just below the eraser. A skinny Sharpie is effective for labeling.
- Optional: 1 personal hand pencil sharpener if your student is bringing wood pencils
- 1 package of red pens, each labeled with your child's name or initials
- 1 package of blue or black pens, each labeled with your child's name or initials
- 6 two-pocket folders
- 2 packages of 3" x 5" ruled index cards
- 2 packages of **wide-rule** notebook paper. Please do **not** get paper that is reinforced with a plastic strip on the side with holes.
- 2 packages of 8.5 x 11 inch graph loose leaf graph paper, **four squares per inch**. (Again, no need to pay for that plastic strip along the side with the holes!)
- 1 set of earbuds
- One ruler (12 inches long with centimeters marked on one side and inches on the other)
- One protractor
- Optional: one compass (for drawing circles)
- 1 active Sno-Isle Library card. (This can be kept at home.)
- If your child is in *fifth grade*, please bring one package of colored Expo brand Low Odor Dry Erase markers, Chisel Tip. (Many other brands do not erase well. Please, oh please, get Expo. Thank you so much.) This is a shared item (for use on the boards).
- If your child is in *sixth grade*, girls please send a box of Band-Aids and boys please bring a roll of paper towels. These are shared items.
- Please do **not** send a box of tissues. I have enough in my classroom and no room to store more.
- Please do **not** send Sharpie markers. If students bring these, they will take them home again.
- No need to send a flash drive as we have requested in past years; since computer documents are now created on Google Classroom, there is no need for it.

I often emphasize with my students that you, as parents, work hard to earn the money to buy them school supplies and that they show respect for their parents when they are respectful of their supplies. Feel free to emphasize that same message when you give all these things to your children.
