In an effort to reduce risk to COVID exposure, we are continuing the policy below for youth sports programs:

With the support of the school administrations, athletic director, and superintendent of schools, the Tuscarawas County Catholic Schools Board of Trustees has adopted the following policy:

To protect the health and safety of our elementary school students, winter youth sports teams sponsored by our parishes and schools will not be permitted to travel or compete against other teams or organizations through January. This suspension of play against outside competitions will be reassessed at that time by the school administrations, pastors, athletic director, and Tuscarawas County Catholic Schools Board of Trustees. Practices and clinics may continue as scheduled in our parish and school facilities within the safety protocols previously put in place and posted in the gymnasiums.

This restriction is in place to protect the health of our students by limiting potential COVID exposure. Our goal is to keep students in school while maintaining their health and physical activity.

This policy applies to all teams and students in grades K-6 representing our parishes and schools. Coaches and students associated with our parish and school teams may not participate in any competition at this time. Participation outside the parish and school team jeopardizes future participation within the Tuscarawas County Catholic Schools organization.
