### May Day Parade:

And then there was the May Day Parade on Saturday, May 6! The church was open for visitors, Bill Mahrt was playing the organ all morning, lemonade was mixed and served to all thirsty paraders and parade watchers. Many thanks to Terry Atkinson, Helen Baumann, Anna Jaklitsch, Judi Swope, Kay Williams, and Lily Farrell from STAYouth for help and hospitality extended to parade-goers.

The parade route was shorter

this year, and the number of paraders was also diminished. The parade took just 35 minutes to pass the front of the church before the paraders poured into Heritage Park across the street.

We collected \$75 in donations from thirsty lemonade-drinkers, welcomed several people into the church for a look-around, and provided bathroom rest stops for several people. We reached out to the Palo Alto community and welcomed those interested..
