Message from Our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

In today's gospel, Jesus compares the value of his preaching of God the Father's word (spiritual food) with the importance of farmers' task of planting and harvesting (physical food). He does so with the first of his parables in the Gospel of Matthew. Jesus praises his apostles who are privileged to fully understand the message of the parables, but warns them they therefore have greater responsibility in handling the word of God--just as we Christians today are. EXEGESIS:

Matthew the evangelist has Jesus begin teaching in parables, possibly because of the lack of faith response by so many Jews to Jesus' previous, more-clear preaching. Jesus' parables can be opaque to his audience; they require an open heart and responsive mind to understand them, and they often have a "punch line" which his audience (and we) do not expect. They also serve as a means of covering with some ambiguity some of his preaching which were subtle criticisms of the pagan Roman government or the hypocritical Jewish leadership.

With this parable of the sower of the seed, Jesus covers the range of responses of people (including us today) to his word which is, after all, the very revelation of God the Father. (a) some people never accept the word of God. (b) Some believe his words for a while, but abandon faith because of persecution. (c) Others believe, then disbelieve because they become overwhelmed by anxiety or pursuit of wealth. (d) And others believe and remain faithful in producing spiritual fruit. The Jews in general and Jesus' followers in particular were familiar with rural and farm work and would easily grasp at least the context of this parable.

Jesus praises his twelve apostles ("disciples" here), because they are privileged in hearing the full revelation of their Old Testament God of history. But his apostles (and any other strong disciples) who believe and understand will be given not only blessings but also greater responsibility to preach in Jesus' name.
