Message from Father Chris

Risk dominates the story in today's gospel. John the Baptist, Jesus' first disciple and Jesus himself are all embarking on a ministry of personal risk in proclaiming the kingdom of God. Christians today must be prepared to take risks in witnessing to their belief in the gospel of Christ. Indeed, many in such places as the Holy Land are suffering intense persecution as they continue as a small minority among the oppressive majority.

EXEGESIS:

This gospel reading by Mark is a variation of the event in John's gospel from last Sunday. The courageous John the Baptist has risked his life by his public criticism of some of the Jewish leaders including King Herod, and how he has been imprisoned. Jesus then begins his own public ministry by expanding upon the Baptist's theme of the need for immediate repentance and preparation for the kingdom of God. Jesus calls his initial apostles, Simon (Peter) being the first mentioned as symbolic of his future headship over the others. Jesus designates them as "fishers of men"; fishing has the themes of seeking, mystery (deep water), patience, food, and risk. Like John the Baptist and Jesus himself, Jesus' disciples will face ultimate risk in their future ministry. They already are risking their livelihood in abandoning their nets. Note that Mark takes care to imply that the father of James and John will not be abandoned, as Mark indicates that the "hired men" will continue assisting the father who is not called by Jesus.
