Only authorized personnel will be allowed into the church until the restoration is completed in July.

Although the Catholic Church in Texas had been recognized as early as 1847, congregations were widely scattered with few priests available to tend the fledgling flocks. However, despite all the seemingly insurmountable obstacles, in 1890, the citizens of the Czech-Catholic community of Granger decided to establish their own church. They met with one W. Keliehor who had offered them land west of Granger on which to build their church. This offer was refused in favor of building in the township of Granger itself. The MKT Railroad had come to the area and a prosperous business community was already establishing itself. As luck would have it, one W H Walton of Austin who owned a vast area of land just west of the newly established community, donated a site for the church for the token sum of \$1.00, at a location that would one day be part of the Walton Addition to the city of Granger.
