This summer, you will also have five writing prompts to respond to. Writing can give us a way to express ourselves and have our voices heard.

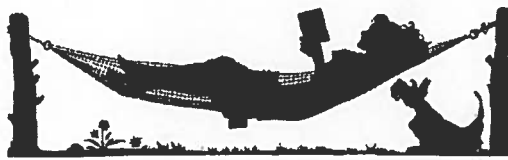
Have you ever learned a new math concept and wondered how it connects to your life? You will have the opportunity to practice your math skills as you train your brain for 5th grade math.
