**The feast of the Body and

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. The story of the relationship of love within God and between God and the human family is embodied in a special way in the person of Jesus, and because Jesus has been united with each human person, this story is embodied in a special way in each human person, in the story of each human life. As Pope Francis has emphasized, we are all connected. Each of our stories is connected. We are also connected to one another and to God. This is the truth which is emphasized this weekend as we celebrate the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. If God is in community as Father, Son and Spirit, doesn't it make sense that we experience God in the community of the Church. And, nothing reflects or reveals this truth any more powerfully than the celebration of the Eucharist we share. Each of our stories matters, each of our stories is connected because we are made

in the image of a God who is eternal connection Ours is a God who is always one but never alone. That is who God is, that is who we are and who we are meant to become more and more fully through how we live each day, as sons and daughters of the Father, walking with the Son as his sisters and brothers, united in the bond of love that is the Holy Spirit. This profound truth is identified first by St. Paul as he develops his insight of the Church as the Body of Christ. All of us sharing our stories and becoming one in the story of Jesus Christ and celebrated at every Eucharist. To give the last word to Pope Francis, "The human person grows more, matures more and is sanctified more to the extent that he or she enters into relationships, going out from themselves to live in communion with God, with others and with all creatures. In this way, they make their own that trinitarian dynamism which God imprinted in them when they were created. Everything is interconnected, and this invites us to develop a spirituality of that global solidarity which flows from the mystery of the Trinity." (Laudato Si' 240)

Has Jesus Been Calling You to Spend Time with Him?

For any relationship to thrive, continue to grow, and deepen, we must share ourselves through time spent together and through conversation. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at St. Vincent de Pau is your opportunity, on Fridays from 9 a.m. - 7 p.m., to be with Jesus. He invites you to spend time with him. He waits for you in the church, and looks forward to spending time with you. He waits to hear all you have to tell him, and all that you have to ask of him. He waits for you to open your heart to hear what he has to say to you. An hour in adoration is your personal time with Jesus to cultivate a true relationship with Him. Sit quietly, or have a silent heart to heart conversation. Be present to Jesus as He is Present to you. Adore him—show him love and Gratitude. Consider his humility as he avails himself to you. In adoration of the Blessed Sacrament we answer the call from the Lord to adore His Real Presence in the Eucharist. We join a line of people that stretches through the centuries, from the stable in Bethlehem in the company of the Angels, shepherds and Magi—through all history to this day. This mystical union of ages and adoring souls has sustained the very heart of the Church. Adoration is the giving of your time to the Lord, and for such a commitment, graces and blessings will be bestowed on you and your loved ones—in this life and the next. Adoration will also strengthen our parish family, and help us to stay focused on the important events in our journey through life. I am new to adoration and am finding it somewhat awkward to fill the hour without becoming distracted. What can I do to remain focused? To help regain your focus when you find your mind drifting away from your conversation with or contemplation of Jesus you can:

- Pray the rosary or Chaplet or the Liturgy of the Hours.
- Read and pray about Scripture or spiritual reading
- Pray for: The intentions of the Pope, The Pope, The Church, Our Priests, our Parish, our Youth and Youth Programs, Vocations, The Right to Life, The family -and any concerns you have.
