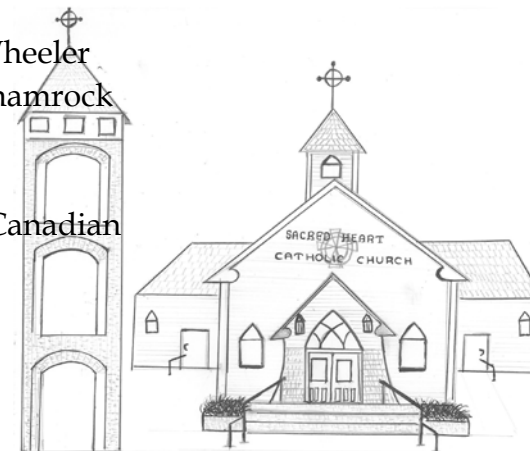

Why going to Mass is one of the best ways to celebrate Thanksgiving

Happy Thanksgiving! While I know the actual Celebration of Thanksgiving is a few days away, any time is a good time to give thanks for all the blessings God has given us in our Lives. Let us Know more about Thanksgiving..

Thanksgiving Day in the United States is often summarized by these two words: food and football. Families across the nation will come together to share a meal and enjoy watching the annual football games that are televised throughout the day. One tradition that many Catholics have incorporated into their day is the celebration of Mass. Parishes often have a special Thanksgiving Mass that is scheduled later in the morning and is sometimes connected to an act of service, such as a meal for the poor or elderly. A reason why the Mass is an appropriate way to celebrate Thanksgiving Day is because the Greek word *Eucharist* means “thanksgiving.” The Mass has always been associated with a desire to give thanks to God for the many blessings that we have received. For this reason the first Catholics who came to the United States offered a Mass of thanksgiving, thanking God for preserving their life after a long voyage over the Atlantic Ocean.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* reinforces this connection of the Mass to a spirit of thanksgiving.

The Eucharist, the sacrament of our salvation accomplished by Christ on the cross, is also a sacrifice of praise in thanksgiving for the work of creation. In the Eucharistic sacrifice the whole of creation loved by God is presented to the Father through the death and the Resurrection of Christ. Through Christ the Church can offer the sacrifice of praise in thanksgiving for all that God has made good, beautiful, and just in creation and in humanity.

The Eucharist is a sacrifice of thanksgiving to the Father, a blessing by which the Church expresses her gratitude to God for all his benefits, for all that he has accomplished through creation, redemption, and sanctification. Eucharist means first of all “thanksgiving.” (CCC 1359-1360)

Let us express our gratitude to God for all the many blessings you have received before diving into the food and football. Complete your Thanksgiving Day by watching football, enjoying a meal and going to Mass.

Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo (Solemnidad)



Noviembre 24, Hoy celebramos la fiesta de **CRISTO EL REY**

Dice el padre Raniero Cantalamessa, predicador de la Residencia Pontificia, que la Solemnidad de Cristo Rey la estableció el Papa Pío XI en 1925 en respuesta a los regímenes políticos ateos y opuestos a Dios y a la Iglesia, como sucedió, por ejemplo, en la revolución mexicana, cuando muchos cristianos afrontaron la muerte exclamando: “¡Viva Cristo Rey!”

La fiesta es reciente, pero su idea central nace con el cristianismo, cuando Cristo empieza a reinar en el mundo. La cruz es su trono, pues había encima de él una inscripción: “Este es el Rey de los judíos.” Aquello que para los enemigos de Cristo justificaba su condena era, a los ojos del Padre celestial, la proclamación de su soberanía universal.

La liturgia misma, en la reforma que siguió al Concilio Vaticano II, sintió la necesidad de trasladar el acento de la fiesta, haciendo énfasis en su aspecto humano y espiritual, más que en el “político”. La oración de la solemnidad pide ahora que “toda criatura, libre de la esclavitud del pecado, le sirva y alabe sin fin.” En esta perspectiva, la cuestión importante no es establecer si Cristo reina o no en el mundo, sino si reina o no dentro de mí; no se trata de si su realeza está reconocida por los Estados y por los gobiernos del mundo, sino si es reconocida y vivida en mi propia persona. ¿Es Cristo Rey y Señor de mi vida? ¿Quién reina dentro de mí?

Según San Pablo, existen dos modos posibles de vivir: para uno mismo o para el Señor (Romanos 14, 7-9). “Para uno mismo” indica una existencia orientada solo a la satisfacción personal y a la propia gloria, sin perspectiva de eternidad. Vivir “para el Señor” significa vivir para obedecer a Cristo, para su gloria y para su Reino.

Es una nueva existencia, frente a la cual la muerte pierde su carácter irreparable. La contradicción más radical ya no es aquella entre vivir o morir, sino entre vivir para uno mismo o para el Señor. ¿Para quién vives tú? “Amado Señor Jesús, quiero vivir exclusivamente para ti y tu gloria.”
