Feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne

On July 26 the Roman Catholic Church commemorates the parents of the Virgin Mary, Saints Joachim and Anne. The couple's faith and perseverance brought them through the sorrow of childlessness, to the joy of conceiving and raising the immaculate and sinless woman who would give birth to Christ.

The New Testament contains no specific information about the lives of the Virgin Mary's parents, but other documents outside of the Biblical canon do provide some details. Although these writings are not considered authoritative in the same manner as the Bible, they outline some of the Church's traditional beliefs about Joachim, Anne and their daughter.

The "Protoevangelium of James," which was probably put into its final written form in the early second century, describes Mary's father Joachim as a wealthy member of one of the Twelve Tribes of Israel. Joachim was deeply grieved, along with his wife Anne, by their childlessness. "He called to mind Abraham," the early Christian writing says, "that in the last day God gave him a son Isaac."

Joachim and Anne began to devote themselves to rigorous prayer and fasting, in isolation from one another and from society. They regarded their inability to conceive a child as a surpassing misfortune, and a sign of shame among the tribes of Israel.

As it turned out, however, the couple were to be blessed even more abundantly than Abraham and Sarah. An angel revealed this to Anne when he appeared to her and prophesied that all generations would honor their future child: "The Lord has heard your prayer, and you shall conceive, and shall bring forth; and your seed shall be spoken of in all the world."

"And Joachim brought the child to the priests," the account continues, "and they blessed her, saying: 'O God of our fathers, bless this child, and give her an everlasting name to be named in all generations'

St. Joachim and St. Anne have been a part of the Church's liturgical calendar for many centuries. Devotion to their memory is particularly strong in the Eastern Catholic churches, where their intercession is invoked by the priest at the end of each Divine Liturgy. The Eastern churches, however, celebrate Sts. Joachim and Anne on a different date, Sept. 9.

Fiesta de los Santos. Joaquín y anne

El 26 de julio, la Iglesia Católica Romana conmemora a los padres de la Virgen María, los Santos Joaquín y Ana. La fe y la perseverancia de la pareja los llevaron a través del dolor de la falta de hijos, a la alegría de concebir y criar a la mujer inmaculada y sin pecado que daría a luz a Cristo.

El Nuevo Testamento no contiene información específica sobre la vida de los padres de la Virgen María, pero otros documentos fuera del canon bíblico proporcionan algunos detalles. Aunque estos escritos no se consideran autorizados de la misma manera que la Biblia, describen algunas de las creencias tradicionales de la Iglesia sobre Joaquín, Ana y su hija.

El "Protoevangelium of James", que probablemente se puso en su forma escrita final a principios del siglo II, describe al padre de María, Joaquín, como un miembro rico de una de las Doce Tribus de Israel. Joachim estaba profundamente afligido, junto con su esposa Anne, por su falta de hijos. "Le recordó a Abraham", dice la escritura cristiana primitiva, "que en el último día Dios le dio un hijo a Isaac".

Joachim y Anne comenzaron a dedicarse a la oración rigurosa y al ayuno, aislados unos de otros y de la sociedad. Consideraron su incapacidad para concebir un hijo como una desgracia inmensa y un signo de vergüenza entre las tribus de Israel.

Sin embargo, resultó que la pareja debía ser bendecida aún más abundantemente que Abraham y Sara. Un ángel le reveló esto a Anne cuando se le apareció y profetizó que todas las generaciones honrarían a su futuro hijo: "El Señor ha escuchado tu oración, y concebirás, y darás a luz; y de tu simiente se hablará en todo el mundo".

"Y Joaquín trajo a la niña a los sacerdotes", continúa el relato, "y la bendijeron, diciendo: 'Oh Dios de nuestros padres, bendice a esta niña y dale un nombre eterno para ser nombrada en todas las generaciones'

San Joaquín y Santa Ana han sido parte del calendario litúrgico de la Iglesia durante muchos siglos. La devoción a su memoria es particularmente fuerte en las iglesias católicas orientales, donde el sacerdote invoca su intercesión al final de cada liturgia divina. Las iglesias orientales, sin embargo, celebran los Santos. Joachim y Anne en una fecha diferente, el 9 de septiembre.
