"Come Be My Light"

After twenty years of being in Calcutta, St. Teresa of Calcutta received a "call within a call" from Jesus. Jesus told her, "I am sending you into the dark holes of the poor. Come, be my light." As soon as she began her work with the poor, St. Teresa experienced an "inner darkness"; she called it an "agony" and a "torture", a "continual longing for God" that

was never satisfied. She felt that God did not want her. In time she understood that she was living a continuous "dark night," an intimate sharing in Christ's desolation on the cross. She viewed it as a "great gift." "All for Jesus," she would repeat. Being destitute she was one with the poor she served. She said, "If I ever become a saint, I will surely be one of darkness. I will continue to be absent from heaven to light the light of those in darkness on earth." We pray: "Dear Saint Teresa of Calcutta, come to us who continue to dwell in the dark! Come, be our light!" O God, who made Saint Peter Claver a slave of slaves and strengthened him with wonderful charity and patience as he came to their help, grant, through his intercession, that, seeking the things of Jesus Christ, we may love our neighbor in deeds and in truth. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Gospel for the Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, Cycle C – Luke 14, 25-33

It is a post-modern misconception to think of Jesus as the ultimate nice person who only said things that everybody loved to hear. Of course Jesus is the perfect model of charity and compassion, but he also gave some very challenging teachings. Today's Gospel is a case in point. Not many people are thrilled by Christ's lesson today that insists God must be first in our lives. Few are those who love to hear this instruction to renounce our beloved things as well as our beloved relationships. But Jesus does not mince words. We are to "hate" our "father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters," and even our own life. It is important to understand that the use of the word "hate" here does not mean to despise anyone or treat him or her unkindly. It means rather to prefer something – or Someone – else, namely God, to these important relationships. In putting God first, inevitably something else must take second place. It means putting all our trust in God, whatever the cost may be.

DISASTER RELIEF INFORMATION

Johnny G. Anderson, Deputy Chief of Staff for John Bel Edwards, hosted a meeting recently in Eunice. Many members of the governor's emergency staff as well as FEMA were present. The following may be useful to you and your family:

- * To apply for Disaster Unemployment Disaster Relief due to loss of job and/or income due to the storm, apply online at laworks.net or call 1-866-783-7567. These benefits are for 27 weeks max and range from \$109 to \$247 per week
- * People who are looking for Disaster Relief Work can register at laworks.net
- * A Disaster Recovery Center has opened in Eunice at Word Ministries (old Walmart building)
- * The deadline to apply for DSNAP benefits in St. Landry Parish has passed
- * DSNAP applications are beginning this week for Evangeline Parish
- * SBA has 2.625% loans available for businesses, individuals, and churches
- * Only two weeks remains to apply for FEMA assistance. There is a 30 day deadline after the disaster decree is issued. Many people are unaware of this.
- * Anyone who needs help with their Flood Insurance Claims can call 1-800-621-3362, Option #2
- * For uprooting of graves, family members need to apply for FEMA assistance on an individual basis. Please be aware that if the family also experienced flood damage, the amount to reinter their family member will be subtracted from their total FEMA assistance amount

In Commemoration of Saint Teresa of Calcutta (*Kolkata*) Saint of Mercy – Holy Year of Mercy

Saint Teresa of Calcutta

Birth Name: Anjezë Gonxhe Bojaxhiu

Born: August 26, 1910

Place of Birth: Skopje, when the city was part of the Ottoman Empire.

Saint Teresa was an ethnic Albanian, but due to the conflicts in the Balkans in the first part of the 20th century – including the First World War – Skopje was under various jurisdictions, so she held at different times Ottoman, Serbian, and Yugoslavian citizenship. She became a citizen of her adoptive India in 1948. Skopje is now the capital of the modern Republic of Macedonia, which declared independence from Yugoslavia in 1991.
