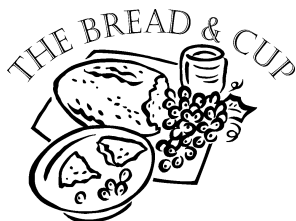

Pastor's Notes:

The greatest of these is Love;

Last week's second reading spoke about the various gifts given to the members of the body of Christ. This week's second reading continues that theme by telling what underlies all the other gifts, namely the gift of love. When we hear this reading proclaimed, most of us think of a wedding that we may have attended. Many couples choose this reading for their special day. But love as a gift of God is not given only to married people nor is it expressed only in the sacrament of marriage. Love needs be the source everything we do. The love of which St. Paul speaks is sacrificial love. It is the love which God our Father showed in sending His Son Jesus to be one of us, to redeem us and the take away our sins. It is the gift which Jesus made real each time He stopped to touch a hurting person or to listen to the cries of the poor or the needs of someone who came to Him. It is the gift that reached its fullest expression in His death on the Cross and his rising from the dead. It is the love that moves men like our guest preacher today to minister to those in need, which strengthens those who are struggling not to give up, which gives the deepest meaning to the everyday works we do to serve the needs of one another. When Paul said that the greatest of all gifts is love, he knew what he was saying. Take his advice. Strive for the greatest gift.

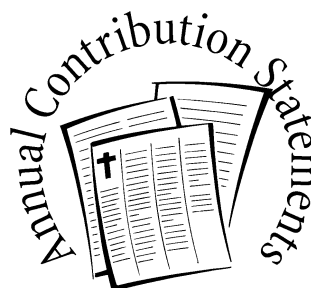
