### Pastor's Notes:

Last Saturday night/Sunday morning there was a powerful lighting storm in Spencer, one of the most active storms I can remember, and it was spectacular! Lightening "fried" parts of our fire alarm system, the elevator, and the Wi-Fi connection. The results of the storm caused me to reflect on how many everyday tasks are done for me. If I want a cup of coffee, I just press a button. If I want to listen to Beethoven's Fifth Symphony, I just press a button. Today we spend significantly less time taking care of our basic human needs than ever before in history. I no longer need to gather sticks to cook my food, nor do I need to hunt or fish to sustain myself. But is society or am I better off with all this extra time? The short answer is "yes." Paradoxically, it seems that my life is made easier in one way, while it becomes more complex in others. As Aristotle said "Nature abhors a vacuum," and humans will also always find ways to fill their lives with activity. So here is a challenge: this week *intentionally* get off-the-grid for five minutes each day. Use that time to reflect on how God is active in your life, and be thankful that we have a microwave and not fire to cook our food, and listen to the soft voice of God speaking deep inside your soul.
