St Joseph's Care Group (SJCG)

1884 St. Joseph's Hospital (SJH) opens on Algoma Street in Port Arthur

1904: St. Joseph's Training School for Nurses to 1970

1967: Smith Clinic for alcoholism addiction at SJH opens in Port Arthur

1979 St. Joseph's Heritage opens on Red River Road in Thunder Bay

1994 – 1997: Two boards met as one

1997: Catholic Health Sponsors of Ontario (CHSO) assume juridic responsibility for SJH

1997: Boards of St. Joseph's Hospital and St. Joseph's Heritage merged to form St. Joseph's Care Group SJCG consisting of St. Joseph's Hospital and Sr. Margaret Smith Centre on Algoma Street, St. Joseph's heritage on Red River Road, the Balmoral (Withdrawal) Centre and the Behavioral Sciences Centre.

2009: SJCG grew to include the LPH, Hogarth Riverview Manor (96 bed LTC), St. Joseph's Mental Health Centre on Victoria Ave. and the Diabetes Centre

2012: new Mental Health Rehabilitation Wing added to the hospital

2013: Sister Leila Greco Apartments (152 one bedroom apartments)

(Date?) Amethyst House: Housing for out of town cancer patients

2019: Dawson Lodge – 30 bed transitional care facility operated by SJCG, Anishinabek Family Care and Thunder Bay Social Services

St. Joseph's Health Centre (SJHC)

1944: Stafford Residence property purchased for 700 Paris Street hospital.

1950: On August 15, 1950 - opening of Sudbury General Hospital of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

1952: Marymount School of Nursing to 1969.

1972: expanded to 360 beds and designated regional trauma referral centre

1987: on recommendation from Hospital Services Restructuring Committee (HSRC), a contract was established between the Sisters' corporation and the regional hospital to oversee chronic care sub-acute and chronic care and palliative care to be constructed at the one site hospital.

1996: In June the Health Services Restructuring Commission (HSRC) began its work to merge the cities three hospitals under one administration. This brought about a change in the role of Sudbury General Hospital: to search out unmet needs in the Sudbury area leading to a focus on the elderly and those in need of chronic care.

1997: On August 14 – SGHOIHOM name change: St. Joseph's Health Centre (SJHC) received its letters patent as a not for profit corporation under the Canada Corporations Act.

1997: Catholic Health Sponsors of Ontario (CHSO) founded to build on the legacy of the Founding Religious Congregations: CSJ-TO, CSJ-SSM and Grey Sisters of the Immaculate Conception Pembroke. Sponsorship of SJH – Thunder Bay, SJH, Elliot Lake and SJHC, Sudbury transferred to this “public juridic person” under canon law and to Catholic Health Corporation of Ontario (CHCO) under civil law.

1998 November: Construction began on the one site Sudbury hospital; estimated cost \$132 million and expected to be open in the spring of 2002.

1998 – 2010 – SJHC Building leased to Sudbury Regional Hospital for their overflow.

2003: December 1 St. Joseph’s Villa (LTC) South Bay Road opened; 128 beds.

2009: St. Joseph’s Continuing Care Centre, (a complex continuing care hospital), South Bay Road opens: 64 beds.

2010: On March 26- Farewell Services for SGHIHOM/SJHC; patients moved March 28, 2010 to the newly completed Sudbury Regional Hospital. The property was sold and on July 28, 2010 formally passed to the purchasers, Panoramic Properties of Niagara Falls.

2011: Villa - St. Gabriel’s Villa (LTC), Chelmsford opened 128 beds.

2020: On April 30: Clarion Hotel Site expansion was added to SJHC to meet Covid-19 demand.
