Celebrating the Liturgy of the Word & Spiritual Communion on a Sunday/Holyday/Weekday – Easter Season

Below is a simple outline to follow when you are not able to participate in a Sunday/Holyday/weekday Eucharist. The complete celebration can be found in a monthly booklet (e.g., *Give Us This Day* now available free at [giveusthisday.org], *Living With Christ* [livingwithchrist.us], or a missal/missalette in your church). If you don't have such a resource, the appropriate Scriptures can be found at the American bishops' website usccb.org/bible/readings, other websites, and, of course, in the Bible. If you are celebrating with others, appoint someone to be the leader; if you are alone, celebrate over the phone with others to make it more communal.

[] Indicates that it is not done alone or on a weekday; **L** = Leader; **R** = Respondent(s)

Pray/sing/chant the **Entrance Antiphon**: "I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia" or sing/listen to a spiritual **Song**.

Make the **Sign of the Cross** +.

[**Greeting**: **L** "The Lord be with you". **R** "And with your spirit."]

Penitential Act: **L** "Lord, have mercy" **R** "Lord, have mercy" **L** "Christ, have mercy" **R** "Christ, have mercy" **L** "Lord, have mercy". **R** "Lord, have mercy."

Pray/sing/chant the **Gloria**.

Pray the **Collect** (Opening Prayer): **L** "Let us pray ... O God, Who on this day, through Your Only Begotten Son, have conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity, grant that we who keep the solemnity of the Lord's Resurrection may, through the renewal brought by Your Spirit, rise up in the light of life. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever." **R** "Amen."

Listen to the **1st Scripture** and then **Reflect** for 15 seconds.

Pray/sing/chant alternatingly the **Responsorial Psalm** with its **Antiphon**.

[Listen to the **2nd Scripture** and then **Reflect** for 15 seconds.]

Pray/sing/chant: "Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia;" then the **Gospel Acclamation**: "Christ, our paschal lamb, has been sacrificed; let us then feast with joy in the Lord;" then repeat "Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia."

Listen to the **Gospel**.

Reflection (If this is a communal celebration, share your thoughts, feelings, or images with each other. A "Daily Reflection-Video" is available at usccb.org/bible/readings or a "reflection" at other websites and in most monthly booklets).

[Profess the **Creed**]

Pray some **Intercessions**, including for the whole world considering the coronavirus crisis, and other needs.

Pray the **Our Father**.

As a way of being in “spiritual communion” with everyone, pray the **Communion Antiphon** together: “Christ our Passover has been sacrificed, alleluia; therefore, let us keep the feast with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth, alleluia, alleluia.” Or use St. Alphonsus Liguori’s Spiritual Communion Prayer.

Also, pray the **Prayer after Communion: L** “Let us pray ... Look upon Your Church, O God, with unfailing love and favor, so that, renewed by the paschal mysteries, she may come to the glory of the Resurrection. Through Christ our Lord.” **R** “Amen.”

Conclude with the **Sign of the Cross +** and perhaps sing another spiritual **Song**.



**Almighty God, we are in need of rain.
