Requirements: registration in parish, baptism preparation class, arrangements are made at least 3 MONTHS prior to the date of the baptism. Sponsors and Christian witnesses need verification of belonging to a Church.

Anointing of the Sick: anyone who is ill and or would like to receive Communion is asked to call the rectory.

Marriage: Couples planning marriage must notify the Parish Rectory at least ONE YEAR in advance for date and necessary info. Pre-Cana classes and F.O.C.C.U.S. Program etc. are required. At least one party must be a registered member of this parish.

All new families who live within our boundaries are welcome to the parish. They are requested to register at the rectory. If a parishioner is not registered, it is difficult for us to issue testimonial letters, recommendations, references, etc. When you move or change your address please notify the rectory beforehand. “It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.” MARK 10:25

Jesus uses tough language that we may not want to hear. But, we are all called to be generous with all our gifts. Not just the ones we pick and choose, but all our gifts: our time in prayer to God, our talent in participating in parish ministries and our treasure supporting our local parish and other charities.

Reflection

Last weekend we heard how Jesus tested the Pharisees so that he could see the hardness of their hearts. When we are tested by God and asked difficult questions, as the Pharisees were, we must reflect on our Catholic beliefs and live out these beliefs each day. In last week's gospel, Jesus reminds us of the importance of family, and how we should not take our families for granted. Just as our relationship with our parents, siblings, and children are sacred, so is our relationship with God. Sometimes it's hard to put our trust completely in God's hands, even though the grace of Christ has the power to sustain us even in weakness. Especially in times of hardship, pain, struggle, loss, these are the most important times to put our trust fully into God's hands, when it is the most challenging. This is how we show God that we are committed to serving Him, even through the storms of life. It's not always easy, sometimes we get angry, frustrated, upset because we do not understand why certain parts of God's plan for us can possibly be, and in these moments, we must remember the love and will of God first. None of us are perfect, although created in the image and likeness of God, we are cracked mirrors of Him that will someday be renewed. In the meantime, it is our call to always encourage and build up one another, to reflect on how we have deviated from God's plan and make a conscious effort to help restore this cracked mirror. I encourage you to reflect on your life, what are some ways you can work towards renewing your trust in God?

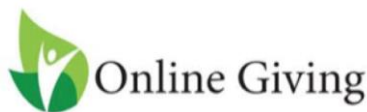

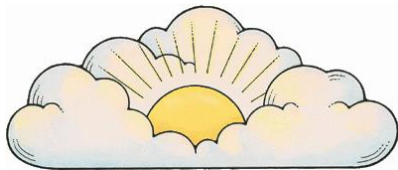


POST CARD CAMPAIGN

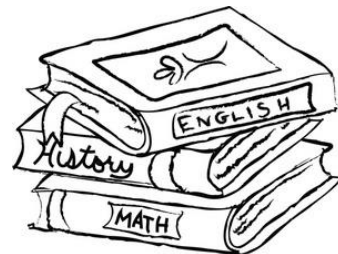

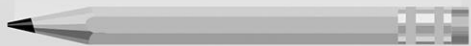
