Baptism: most Sundays at 1:30pm.
Requirements: registration in parish, baptism preparation class, arrangements are made at least 3 MONTHS prior to the date of the baptism. Sponsors and Christian witnesses need verification of belonging to a Church.

Anointing of the Sick: anyone who is ill and or would like to receive Communion is asked to call the rectory.

Marriage: Couples planning marriage must notify the Parish Rectory at least ONE YEAR in advance for date and necessary info. Pre-Cana classes and F.O.C.C.U.S. Program etc. are required. At least one party must be a registered member of this parish.

All new families who live within our boundaries are welcome to the parish. They are requested to register at the rectory. If a parishioner is not registered, it is difficult for us to issue testimonial letters, recommendations, references, etc. When you move or change your address please notify the rectory beforehand. "And Jesus said to him, 'Go your way; your faith has made you well.' And immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way."

MARK 10:52

Faith is believing in something even though you may not be able to see it. Many people think that miracles don't happen anymore. But, if you focus on the positive, not the negative, focus on your blessings instead of your hardships, miracles will seem common and you will see God's active presence in your daily life.

Reflection

Last weekend we were shown the difference between doing something nice for the right reasons verses doing something nice for selfish and wrong reasons. Last week James and John made the other disciples and Jesus very frustrated and upset by acting as though they were more holy or more deserving of Jesus' love and attention than the other disciples. Everyone has, at one point or another, done something out of selfish intent, whether we want to admit it or not. God granted all of us the gift of free will and it is up to us to decide what we will choose. Sometimes, we unfortunately must learn some very important life lessons the hard way, which doesn't make anyone a bad person, it just means we require a little more experience to see things from another perspective. Everybody wants to be somebody, and at times that has translated into choosing power over love or getting caught up in the idea of being a leader and then lording it over others. The disciples just never completely grasped the idea of what Jesus was telling them. However, they learned from their mistakes and mistrust, they asked for forgiveness and kept their faith in Jesus alive and nurtured their relationship with Him. Jesus wants us to get ahead, but not at the expense of others. We should look to this incident with James and John as a lesson to serve Jesus by helping others, not only by helping ourselves. We, too, must go beyond ourselves to show our faith in God, and we do this through our actions and words. If we choose to do this, we will also be welcomed to sit at the table of the Lord. I encourage you to think about what it means to be a disciple of Christ in your life – what will you do for Jesus?


Saint of the Week: St. Martin de Pore



St. Martin de Pore was the son of a Spanish Knight and a freed woman of Panama.

Unfortunately, during his time it was looked down upon to have

what was considered an impure bloodline, and his family was treated horribly by their society. People expected St. Martin to become bitter, but instead he focused on the positive aspects of his life and how he could help others given his position. He worked many labor jobs and spent most of his time caring for the poor and sick. He also co-founded an orphanage and helped care for refugees from other countries – he was truly a man of charity. He is now known as the Patron Saint of African Americans, Barbers, Hairdressers, Race Relations, Radio, and Social Justice. May we learn from his example, to speak out for God in a society that has great difficulty dealing with race, poverty, and care for the outcast.



Vote Expected on NJ Assisted Suicide Bill – Action Required!

On Monday, October 29, 2018, the New Jersey General Assembly very likely will vote on the Aid in Dying for the Terminally Ill Act (A1504). The bill would allow physicians to prescribe drugs to end the lives of terminally ill individuals considered to have six months to live.

The facts are clear - in California, in Vermont and in Oregon - states that have passed assisted suicide bills - insurance companies have denied individuals expensive healthcare coverage but offered them low cost drugs to end their life.

In an era of cost control and managed care, patients with lingering illnesses may be branded as a financial liability for the insurance company, and decisions to encourage death could be driven by reducing costs.

Gospel Today Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time | Mark 10:46-52
