Baptism: most Sundays at 1:30pm.
Requirements: registration in parish, baptism preparation class, arrangements are made at least 3 MONTHS prior to the date of the baptism. Sponsors and Christian witnesses need verification of belonging to a Church.

Anointing of the Sick: anyone who is ill and or would like to receive Communion is asked to call the rectory.

Marriage: Couples planning marriage must notify the Parish Rectory at least ONE YEAR in advance for date and necessary info. Pre-Cana classes and F.O.C.C.U.S. Program etc. are required. At least one party must be a registered member of this parish.

Parish Membership

All new families who live within our boundaries are welcome to the parish. They are requested to register at the rectory. If a parishioner is not registered, it is difficult for us to issue testimonial letters, recommendations, references, etc. When you move or change your address please notify the rectory beforehand. Anyone 18 years of age/older not in school must be registered separate of their family. Thank you.

"Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God."

PHILLIPIANS 4:6

St. Paul reminds us that our God is an abundant God, the ultimate giver of gifts. He promises to give us all that we need. When we trust that God will take care of us, it is easier for us to share what we have been given.

Reflection

Last weekend's scripture was about John the Baptist and how, by spreading God's word, he smoothed many paths for Jesus to further spread the gospel. If you've been listening to scripture the last few weeks, you would have heard what a sinful and terrible place earth was when the scriptures were being written. Although times have changed, and people have evolved, the earth is still just as sinful, if not worse. We all struggle with our own sinfulness on a day to day basis, but it is never too late to forgive and seek forgiveness and acceptance. Advent is a time for reflection, to prepare your life for the coming of Jesus Christ, our Lord. As we prepare for the coming of Jesus, we are also running around trying to get all the ingredients for baking cookies and trying to find everything on the Christmas wish lists of our friends and families. they receive something that is heartfelt. This third Sunday of Advent, we light our Rose candle, which is known as the Shepherd's Candle and symbolizes joy. May we remember to make time to feel the pure joy and rejoicing that comes with the Christmas season.




There was a ring found in the Church last week. It's a tiger's eye stone with a gold band. It is now in the rectory.

ST. JOHN VIANNEY SCRIP PROGRAM

For several years the St. John Vianney school community has participated in a fundraising program known as the Scrip Program. We would now like to open this program to the entire parish community. Scrip simply means "substitute money". When you purchase Scrip, you are purchasing gift cards that are used exactly as cash. You can use Scrip to purchase everyday items such as food, gas, clothing and other essentials. With every gift card you purchase you are earning revenue for St. John Vianney. Your gift card is worth exactly the amount you purchased it for - \$100, \$50, \$25, \$10. We earn the revenue from the vendor by purchasing it at a discount. This is a fundraiser that does not require you to spend money on things you wouldn't normally buy.

We will be selling gift cards after the 5:00 pm mass on Saturdays, and after the 9:00 am, 10:45 am and 12:15 pm masses on Sundays, beginning January 6, 2019. We will be selling grocery stores (Acme, Foodtown, Shop Rite, Stop n Shop, Wegmans and Whole Foods); gas stations (BP, Exxon, Gulf, Shell, Speedway and Wawa), Home Depot, Target and WalMart.

There are many other gift cards for purchase at the Rectory, and even more gift cards available if you order through GLScrip company. Gift cards can be purchased with cash or a personal check. Our parish adult choir enhances our liturgies each Sunday from September through mid-June. 2018 Parish Mass Headcount – The Numbers are In!

Have you noticed people walking around with paper and pencil during the Offertory the past few weeks? Did you wonder what they were doing? Every year the Bishop’s Office asks every Parish in the Diocese to count the number of persons attending every weekend Mass during the first four weekends in November.

First, a big THANK YOU to the Extraordinary Ministers who walked around counting people! We counted *everyone* – not just people in the pews...we counted: the Priest; the Deacon, if any; Altar Servers; the Organist; the Cantor, the members of the Choirs; the Extraordinary Ministers; the Lector; Ushers (whether or not wearing the red jacket); people standing; people in the crying room; and we even spotted some up in the balcony. Our Seminarian was here for a couple of the Masses, so we also counted Jay.

So, what did we learn? Using averages for the four weeks of November:

Mass with the highest attendance: 10:45 am (average 267.5 people per Mass)
Mass with the second highest attendance: 5:00 pm (average 253 people per Mass)

Interestingly, these were the same two Masses as last year, but the order flipped!

Curious about the others?

7:00 pm average 120.75 people per Mass (modest increase as compared to 2017)
7:00 am average 117.75 people per Mass (modest increase as compared to 2017)
9:00 am average 233.75 people per Mass (modest decrease as compared to 2017)
12:15 pm average 255.5 people per Mass (modest decrease as compared to 2017)

Altar servers were commissioned 9:00 Mass on November 18th. Attendance at that Mass exceeded the attendance at any other Mass during November, with 327 people in attendance.

What else did we observe? Unless there is something special happening like the Altar Server Commissioning, more people sit in the back two sections of the Church than in the front two sections. With respect to the front, more people tend to sit in the front left (organ side) than in the front right (Mary side) section. So, if you are running late for Mass and want to get a seat – head up to one of the front sections!

Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe



In October, our Bishop announced plans to consecrate our Diocese of Metuchen to Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12, 2019. To be consecrated means to be set apart for a holy purpose. His hope is to increase the holiness of life and bring about a renewed commitment to the Gospel message as we hope to share that message with others. Beginning this **December 12, 2018 (the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe)** we will begin a year of preparation.

There will be many activities both on the parish and diocesan levels which will enhance this year of preparation.

1. On **Wednesday December 12** there was a **special mass at 9:30 am in our church** at which time we hung our banner of Our Lady of Guadalupe. There are special candles available for you to light all year before the image.
2. There are **special prayer cards** available in English, Spanish and Polish on the table in the gathering area of our church.
3. We will say the **prayer before each weekend mass** – copies will be in the cover of the hymn book. We will discontinue the Prayer to St. Michael at the end of mass but encourage you to continue saying it privately.
4. In January there will be a **special movie** shown (both in the morning and evening) about Our Lady of Guadalupe. The exact dates will be announced.

5. Finally there will be a **traveling image of Our Lady of Guadalupe**. There will be 2 for the **school**, which will have further details on how this will take place in the school. There will be 1 for **CCD** and they will explain further details. There will be 1 for our **homebound** parishioners. Our Eucharistic Ministers will bring the image from person to person each week if they wish. They will have more details in the future.

There will be 2 for our parish. Beginning the **weekend of December 16**, we will be encouraging people to sign up to take the image home, along with a kit that contains prayers, rosaries, holy water etc. The image and **kit will be given to you at the 9:00 am Mass on the Sunday you select and be returned the following week at the 9:00 am Mass** where the host family will hand it off to the new family for the next week.

There will be a sign-up book available in the church lobby by the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe, where you can select a week during which you will “host” the image and gather to pray each day/night. We encourage not just **families** but **single parishioners** also to participate in this program.

It is our hope and prayer that this special year will light a fire in our hearts to renew our dedication to our parish and the church. Please watch the bulletin for other upcoming events. God bless you.



WEEK 3 Cut, color and fold our third advent candle - tape or glue this pink candle to the 9" paper plate or cardboard circle that was used for the first two candles. Place as shown on the diagram at right.
