Sacramental Schedule

Reconciliation: Saturdays 11am-12pm & after 7pm
Anytime in the rectory – call ahead

Baptism: most Sundays at 1:30pm.
Requirements: registration in parish, baptism preparation class, arrangements are made at least 3 MONTHS prior to the date of the baptism. Sponsors and Christian witnesses need verification of belonging to a Church.

Anointing of the Sick: anyone who is ill and or would like to receive Communion is asked to call the rectory.

Marriage: Couples planning marriage must notify the Parish Rectory at least ONE YEAR in advance for date and necessary info. Pre-Cana classes and F.O.C.C.U.S. Program etc. are required. At least one party must be a registered member of this parish.

Parish Membership

All new families who live within our boundaries are welcome to the parish. They are requested to register at the rectory. If a parishioner is not registered, it is difficult for us to issue testimonial letters, recommendations, references, etc. When you move or change your address please notify the rectory beforehand. Anyone 18 years of age/older not in school must be registered separate of their family. Thank you.

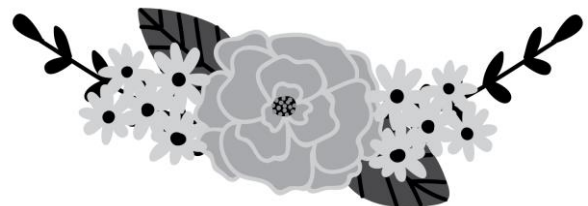

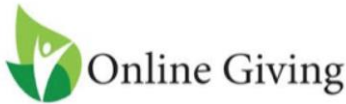

St. Paulinus grew up in a noble family in France, later renouncing his title, marrying, getting baptized and moving to Spain. Following the death of their son, he and his wife set out to live a life of charity and helping the less fortunate

in Spain. These charitable acts and devotion to his faith led St. Paulinus to the priesthood and later became the bishop of Nola. He gave away majority of his property and always found ways to help those in need, truly living a monastic life. St. Paulinus was a friend to many including saints Augustine, Jerome, Melania, Martin, Gregory the Great, and Ambrose. May we be inspired by St. Paulinus' willingness to share his gifts and time with others, no matter the cost, and strive to be more like him in our lives.

Summer Schedule

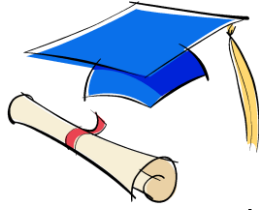
Please note that after June 15th, we will be moving into our Summer Schedule and the 7:00pm Mass as well as Scrip sales after Masses will be going on hiatus.
