**Sacramental Schedule**

Reconciliation: Saturdays 11am-12pm, 4:15-4:45pm  
Anytime in the rectory – call ahead

Baptism: most Sundays at 1:30pm.  
Requirements: registration in parish, baptism preparation class, arrangements are made at least 3 MONTHS prior to the date of the baptism. Sponsors and Christian witnesses need verification of belonging to a Church.

Anointing of the Sick: anyone who is ill and or would like to receive Communion is asked to call the rectory.

Marriage: Couples planning marriage must notify the Parish Rectory at least ONE YEAR in advance for date and necessary info. Pre-Cana classes and F.O.C.C.U.S. Program etc. are required. At least one party must be a registered member of this parish.

**Parish Membership**

All new families who live within our boundaries are welcome to the parish. They are requested to register at the rectory. If a parishioner is not registered, it is difficult for us to issue testimonial letters, recommendations, references, etc. When you move or change your address please notify the rectory beforehand. Anyone 18 years of age/older not in school must be registered separate of their family. Thank you.

**July 14, 2019 – 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

*“Jesus said to him, ‘Go and do likewise.’”*

**LUKE 10:37**

This was Jesus’ command at the end of the Good Samaritan story. Did you know that the Samaritans and Jews despised each other? The moral of the story is to love our neighbor. That means loving someone you may not know or someone who looks different than you or someone that you don’t like. All without expecting anything in return.

**Reflection**

Last weekend we heard about Jesus’ calling to all of us to be His laborers saying, “Rejoice because your names are written in Heaven.” When we hear this it’s God calling us to action. God is calling us to proclaim His name, spread His Gospel and share His message of love and acceptance of all His children, all His creation. It can be easy to fall into the persuasions and opinions of others who may not understand or want to understand our faith. Sometimes we can feel like lambs among the wolves, but we must look to God and trust in Him that He will continue to steer us in the right direction on our journey. We can’t let the opinions of others dictate how we live out our faith. When we feel the overwhelming pressure of others to go against our faith, look to the example of Jesus. Jesus, the lamb that was sacrificed to the wolves, the doubters, all this happened so that we may always have Him to turn to when things get overwhelming, like we can’t bare anymore. It’s to show us there is life, a better eternal life with God after all these earthly tests have concluded. These tests are meant to prepare a way for Jesus to come again on the earth, and our mission is to prepare the earth for Him. As we enter this next week, think about something you could be doing in your daily life to prepare the way for Jesus. Think about and act on a way you can show unconditional love to someone else, like He would, without expecting anything else in return.

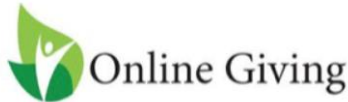
**St. Isidore's Garden**

**Saint of the Week: St. Henry**



St. Henry was the emperor of the Holy Roman Empire. He studied with St. Wolfgang and always had a deep interest in holy affairs. On his way back from conflict one time he stopped at the abbey of Monte Cassino, which was

founded by St. Benedict. While there, St. Henry fell ill, and it is known that St. Benedict cured him with combining medicinal herbs and the power of prayer. St. Henry went on to grow in faith from the experience, founding the See of Bamberg, creating its cathedral and much more. St. Henry is well known throughout the world to have been a just ruler and prayerful man. May we look to him as an example of finding balance and integration between our faith and daily lives.
