Sacramental Schedule

Reconciliation: Saturdays 11am-12pm, 4:15-4:45pm
Anytime in the rectory – call ahead

Baptism: most Sundays at 1:30pm.
Requirements: registration in parish, baptism preparation class, arrangements are made at least 3 MONTHS prior to the date of the baptism. Sponsors and Christian witnesses need verification of belonging to a Church.

Anointing of the Sick: anyone who is ill and or would like to receive Communion is asked to call the rectory.

Marriage: Couples planning marriage must notify the Parish Rectory at least ONE YEAR in advance for date and necessary info. Pre-Cana classes and F.O.C.C.U.S. Program etc. are required. At least one party must be a registered member of this parish.

Parish Membership

All new families who live within our boundaries are welcome to the parish. They are requested to register at the rectory. If a parishioner is not registered, it is difficult for us to issue testimonial letters, recommendations, references, etc. When you move or change your address please notify the rectory beforehand. Anyone 18 years of age/older not in school must be registered separate of their family. Thank you.

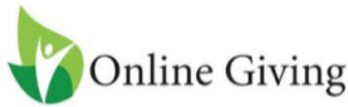

St. Bernard entered the Benedictine abbey of Citeaux with 7 family members and about 30 friends following his lead. After three years he was made abbot of the new monastery called Clairvaux, meaning valley of lights. St.

Bernard became widely known as a counselor and his word was highly respected and sought after. As time progressed he was pulled away from the monastery more frequently and led to St. Bernard preaching the Second Crusade throughout Europe. When he died years later, it is said that all of Europe mourned. St. Bernard has many titles including, the man of the 12th century, papal advisor, defender of faith, scripture scholar, eloquent preacher, doctor of the Church etc. May we look to St. Bernard and always stand up for the faith we believe in.
