Baptism: most Sundays at 1:30pm.

Requirements: registration in parish, baptism preparation class, arrangements are made at least 3 MONTHS prior to the date of the baptism. Sponsors and Christian witnesses need verification of belonging to a Church.

Anointing of the Sick: anyone who is ill and or would like to receive Communion is asked to call the rectory.

Marriage: Couples planning marriage must notify the Parish Rectory at least ONE YEAR in advance for date and necessary info. Pre-Cana classes and F.O.C.C.U.S. Program etc. are required. At least one party must be a registered member of this parish.

All new families who live within our boundaries are welcome to the parish. They are requested to register at the rectory. If a parishioner is not registered, it is difficult for us to issue testimonial letters, recommendations, references, etc. When you move or change your address please notify the rectory beforehand. December 1, 2019 1ST Sunday of Advent

"Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come." MATTHEW 24:42

People who have had health issues or near-death experiences generally have a greater appreciation for each day being a gift from God. The rest of us usually take for granted that we will be around tomorrow. But when you start to look at each day as a gift, you realize all the little miracles that happen daily and grow in gratitude for all that we have been given. You begin to see God's active presence in your life.

Reflection

This first Sunday of Advent, we light the first purple candle on the Advent Wreath. The first purple candle is the Prophecy candle and signifies Hope. This first candle is meant to signify the Prophecy that God was sending the earth His one true Son to save all of us and that He is coming soon. The color purple is often associated with prayer and penance, which is perfectly fitting since Advent is a time of reflection and waiting. With waiting for Jesus' first coming, we are filled with Hope that the Prophecy will be fulfilled. Lighting this first Advent candle is a symbol of Hope that we are casting a light in the darkness of our lives, no matter what we may be going through. For me, my light in the darkness is Jesus, who is also referred to as "The Light of the World." This Advent season I encourage you all to use this month of December as a time of reflection. What did this last year offer you? Are you content with what the year has given you? What are some ways you can slow down, enjoy living in the moment, and be fully present? Reflect on what

ways you are going to use the blessings and gifts you have been given to better your life, and the lives around you in the coming year. It's never too late to find your inner light or to help others see the light inside of them.

ST. JOHN VIANNEY SCRIP PROGRAM

For several years the St. John Vianney school community has participated in a fundraising program known as the Scrip Program. We would now like to open this program to the entire parish community. Scrip simply means "substitute money". When you purchase Scrip, you are purchasing gift cards that are used exactly as cash. You can use Scrip to purchase everyday items such as food, gas, clothing and other essentials. With every gift card you purchase you are earning revenue for St. John Vianney. Your gift card is worth exactly the amount you purchased it for - \$100, \$50, \$25, \$10. We earn the revenue from the vendor by purchasing it at a discount. This is a fundraiser that does not require you to spend money on things you wouldn't normally buy.

We will be selling gift cards after the 5:00 pm mass on Saturdays, and after the 9:00 am, 10:45 am and 12:15 pm masses on Sundays, beginning this weekend, December 1, 2019. We will be selling grocery stores (Acme, Foodtown, Shop Rite, Stop n Shop and Wegmans); gas stations (BP, Exxon, Gulf, Shell, Speedway and Wawa), Home Depot, Target, WalMart, Dunkin Donuts, Starbucks and Amazon.

There are many other gift cards for purchase at the Rectory, and even more gift cards available if you order through the GLScrip company. Gift cards can be purchased with cash or a personal check. St. Tsidores Garden

Saint Isidore's Garden had its most successful year ever in 2019. Through the hard work of our volunteers and the generous support of our business partners, we were able to donate an incredible amount of produce to our hungry neighbors. We supported the food pantries at Saint James in Woodbridge, Saint Cecelia in Iselin and Saint Anthony of Padua in Port Reading. We started the season with \$200 worth of plants and were able to convert that into 2110 pounds of vegetables. Our breakdown is as follows: 244.7 pounds of zucchini and yellow squash 99.7 pounds of cucumbers 261.8 pounds of eggplant 113.5 pounds of banana peppers 316.2 pounds of green bell peppers 54.25 pounds of onions 57.0 pounds of jalapeno peppers 23.0 pounds of Hungarian peppers 903.5 pounds of tomatoes 33.5 pounds of beets 3.0 pounds of basil

Our garden is pesticide free and utilizes only compost as fertilizer. We are proud to offer safe, healthful food options to the clients of our local food pantries.



Gospel Today First Sunday of Advent / Matthew 24:37-44

Jesus wants us to lead good lives and help others, so we are ready when He comes again.


FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Directions

- [4] After you have 4 weeks of trees colored, filled in and cut out, attach week 1 to week 2 by matching the corner letters and gluing or taping halves together up to the fold line. Do the same for week 3 and week 4, which will then attach to week 1 and 2 to complete.


